Last Friday, fourteen Year 3 and 4 students headed down to the Darebin Community Basketball Stadium to compete against 9 district schools for the Reservoir High Cup. Our students were very excited to be representing Our Lady of the Way and showed excellent sportsmanship throughout the day.



Many of our players had never played competitive basketball on full sized indoor courts and so it was very rewarding to see them take the floor and play with great heart, spirit and no fear!

Our Boys team started off with a win against Kingsbury Primary, with an exceptionally high scoring game of 32 - 0. They began to show their strengths as a team, showing great communication, team work and excellent dribbling and shooting skills. Additional wins 16 - 4 against Thomastown Primary and 30 - 6 against Reservoir Views Primary led them to be top of their pool.

They were successful in making it to the grand final against St Joseph the Worker. In an incredibly intense game, they remained undefeated, finishing on top of all nine schools with a well - earned win of 16 - 6 points! The new Reservoir High Cup Champions for 2017!!!! In a column in yesterday's *Australian* the journalist and TV host Geraldine Doogue put it all very well:

...I remind myself and other Catholics that our church truly represents far more than these stories (i.e. of abuse): 700,000 school children in the Catholic sector, served by 82,000 staff, 66 hospitals including 19 public hospitals run by church-related entities. The St Vincent de Paul Society is the most extensive volunteer welfare network in the country and the church is the largest welfare provider outside government.

In a more spiritual vein, she went on to add:

...as a source of ongoing consolation and meaning, of searching alongside others not merely alone, the broader Catholic Church simply has no peer.

This is finally perhaps where we can at last bring to bear on it all some words of Jesus in today's Gospel.

Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the One (God the Father) who sent me. If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones..., then I tell you solemnly, they will most certainly not lose their reward.

Ultimately, everything members of the Catholic community- laypeople, religious sisters and brothers, clergy, - everything they do is inspired by that vision: that in serving others they are serving Christ our Lord, who is much himself the embodiment of the God we cannot see. That vision is so much part of the 'treasure' we carry in the 'clay vessels' of our humanity.

Whatever may be the outcome of the legal process presently being put in place in connection with Cardinal Pell, a process that he and we will have to live with doubtless for some years, our task is not to lose heart. It is to carry the 'treasure' that we have been given the immense privilege of holding and communicating to the world, our knowledge of Jesus Christ and the good news of God's love and the hope that this brings into the world.
