Our students were very excited to be representing Our Lady of the Way and showed excellent sportsmanship, team work, spirit and pride throughout the day.



Our Boys team started off with a win against Kingsbury Primary, with a high scoring game of 25-7. They began to show their strengths as a team, showing great communication, team work and excellent dribbling and shooting skills. Additional high scoring wins 31-0 against Maharishi Primary, a close game

and win 13-11 against Thomastown Primary, and a final win 20-15 against Reservoir Views Primary led them to be top of their pool. They were successful in making it to the Grand Final against Reservoir Primary School who was also undefeated.
