### **EDUCATION BOARD**

- to provide advice on school policies when required, to plan for the future of the parish primary school and its ability to accommodate future enrolments.

- Commitment to the vision and mission of the parish and school
- An understanding of the role of parish priest, principal and board members
- Willingness to ask questions and seek clarification
- Ability to think strategically
- Willingness to support the contributions of other board members
- Capacity to listen in an active and meaningful way
- Willingness to work co-operatively with others
- Commitment to maintaining confidentiality at all times.

# CSEF - CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURIONS FUND

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for primary school students.

# LITERACY NEWS

### **Professional Development for Staff**

This year Our Lady of the Way is further developing our Literacy program by using the skills and expertise of external Literacy Consultants. As a staff we will be focussing on the teaching of comprehension, working in partnership with Literacy Tutors from Melbourne University. The consultants, Martina Tassone and Marian Corsetti, are also running our school closure professional development days this year. You might see Marian Corsetti at OLW on Tuesdays, as she will also be working in the classrooms to model and collaborate best teaching practices in reading.

### **Take Home Readers Years Prep-2**

Students in Year 1 & 2 have already started bringing books home to read as their reader. The Preps will begin this process shortly. Reading at home with your child has many academic and social emotional benefits. We must stress the importance of getting students motivated to read and be engaged in books.

### Prep

In Prep this year, take home readers will be brought home on a Monday and returned on the Friday. Children in Prep will bring 5 readers home on a Monday to be returned on Friday. The children need to read each night, it is the practise of reading each night that help students with decoding, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension strategies. Some students may read 1 book each night, a couple of books each night or the same book each night. To engage students in reading, let the children have the chance to choose the book they want to read. Please do not bring readers back to school to be changed on a day other than Friday. If only 3 books are returned on a Friday, then they will only be allowed to take 3 books home the following week.

### Year 1 & 2

In Year 1 & 2, students will have the opportunity to change their readers on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Some students will have longer and more detailed books that they may wish to keep for a week. Other students will read the same book each night. Repeated reading of a book is a great opportunity to improve fluency and vocabulary.

Please remember to fill in the reading journal with your child each night and ensure that reading occurs every night for 15 - 20 minutes.





**Rose Marie Prosser:** During the Lenten season this year Rose Marie will be having discussions with us on how our image of God has changed over the years and how we all have a different life story to tell because we are on our own journey. This is a general guide for the discussion during the month of March. So, on Wednesday the 8<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> March 10.45 in the foyer, Rose Marie will be with is once again. All are welcome.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I write to you as the final hearing involving the Catholic Church at the Royal Commission into Child Sexual Abuse commences in Sydney on 6 February 2017. The hearing is expected to conclude at the end of February.

For the victims and survivors, for the Catholic community and for many in the wider Australian community, this hearing may be a difficult and even distressing time, as the Royal Commission reviews the evidence it has already received and seeks to understand why and how this evil occurred.

Deeply mindful of the hurt and pain caused by abuse, I once again offer my apology on behalf of the Catholic Church. I am sorry for the damage that has been done to the lives of victims of sexual abuse. As Pope Francis said recently, 'it is a sin that shames us'.

Over the next three weeks, evidence presented during the Royal Commission hearings will be analysed, statistics about the extent of abuse will be made public, and the way forward will be explored. Many of our bishops and other Catholic leaders will appear before the Royal Commission. They will explain what the Church has been doing to change the old culture that allowed abuse to continue, to put in place new policies, structures and protections to safeguard children and vulnerable persons and to respond effectively when allegations of abuse are made.

Pope Francis has urged the whole Church to, 'find the courage needed to take all necessary measures and to protect in every way the lives of our children, so that such crimes may never be repeated'.

I join my commitment and that of the Archdiocese to that of Pope Francis to do all that is necessary in the Archdiocese to ensure that there is no repeat of these evil crimes.

Throughout the coming weeks, I want to assure the survivors and all those affected by abuse in the Archdiocese and all Catholics of my thoughts and prayers. I encourage you to turn in prayer to the one who is always ready to listen: Jesus Christ, who brings healing and hope.
