Dear Parents & Families,

As part of our whole school focus on Self & Wellbeing this term, our students were learning about how we stay or keep safe. The particular focus for our senior students was about staying safe online.

A survey of our senior students provided some interesting but generally reassuring results. I have shared some of the responses to the survey in today's newsletter as I think that these would make a great discussion point for families across all age levels, especially as holidays are about to begin and children will have more free time to access online activities. In particular, it would be good to speak with your children about their social networking activities, staying safe online, and what is a healthy amount of time to spend online.

MID YEAR REPORTS

Mid-Year Reports will be distributed to families this Thursday. Please spend time discussing your child's achievements with them so that they are aware of your support for their efforts and progress. This report is a follow on from your Parent – Teacher interview in Term 1, with the next round of Parent – Teacher interviews set for the end of Term 3.

As schools are required to move towards the new Victorian Curriculum, you will notice a few more changes in the names of some subject areas and how and when subjects are assessed. Under the new system, more subjects will begin to receive a score at the earlier grade levels. The tracking of progress from Year 1 -6 may also have some anomalies in 2017 and 2018. Please read the cover letter going home with the report which will further assist parents in understanding these changes.


Currently we have only 1 blanket donated and are desperately seeking some more as we would love to be able to help those less fortunate than us this winter.

Students or families are able to leave all clean blankets at the collection area in the school office. The SRC will organise their distribution with the local St Vinnies sub-branch.




Are you a member of a social networking site?




How long have you been using social networking sites?




How many social networking site are you a member of or use?




On average, how much time do you spend (outside of school) on a social networking/gaming sites?




How many contacts/friends do you have on the social networking/gaming sites?




Do you interact with other children you don't know in social networking sites?






Are you parents aware of your social networking activities?

Thank you for your interest in the Kingsbury July Holiday Program. As a part of our sustainability initiative, Kingsbury OSHC Program is now eliminating all unnecessary use of paper. In an attempt to help the environment, all information is now provided on one simple sheet. Program Information

Holiday Program runs from **7:45am to 6:00pm**. Breakfast club is open **until 9:00am**.

Children MUST arrive at the program before the specified time on excursion day. Staff are NOT responsible for electrical items or other toys brought into the program. Children are NOT to bring money with them to the program or on an excursion day. Children MUST bring socks on excursions.

How to book places

Step 1

For NEW families to My Family Lounge (MFL), click on the My Family Lounge banner found on the OSHC page within the Kingsbury Primary School Website and then click on the REGISTER button. You will then be taken through a registration process to create your My Family Lounge (MFL) account.

Step 2

Log into your My Family Lounge (MFL) account and tell us about you, your child and any additional details or contacts.

Step 3

Log in to either My Family Lounge on your computer or log into the My Family Lounge app on iPhone or Android. Select the 'Vacation Care' room on the Casual Booking Calendar and book on the day/s you require. All information about the day is provided on the casual booking calendar and on this sheet.

You're done! Confirmation of the booking will change the day from green to blue on the Casual Booking Calendar!

Please tick the days required on this form and return it to the program if you do not have access to My Family Lounge.



Parent voices...

Jack Cusack – a modern day Dad.

Jack is an 86 year old Dad who has lived in the same three bedroom house in Reservoir, where he and his wife Monica raised their 14 children. They will celebrate their 60th wedding anniversary this month! They are still very active in the local community and busy with their 33 grand children and 5 great children.

I took a Dictaphone around and had a chat to them about what it was like being a Darebin Dad back in the fifties and sixties, what kind of Dad Jack was, and how the modern Dads of today compare. Here is some of what Jack and his wife Monica had to say:

Q: How were you involved with your family when you were young? Were there distinct roles and tasks for men and women?

Jack: Well, there was bit I did everything; I used to do the washing and mopping. I'd change nappies and change the kids...with 14 kids it was a bit of a necessity.

Monica: Yep, he'd walk the floor with the kids back then too and get up in the night to settle them.

Q: So you were like a modern Dad back in the 50's and 60's. I've heard Dads who were raising their kids in the seventies say that they wish they'd had the time with their kids that a lot of Dads get today. So Jack must have been considered a bit unusual back then.

Monica: He was, yes. Most of the men back then wouldn't lift a finger when it came to housework. My friend used to say, "Wow, how much do you want for him? We'll buy him. He's a good husband." (Chuckles)

Q: And what about your children? Did they see anything unusual about it? Did they notice that their Dad was doing things around the house other Dads didn't?

Monica: I don't think they took much notice because children didn't hang around inside at other people's houses then. Today they're inside at their friends' houses playing computer games and seeing what the adults do but in our day they'd be outside playing all the time, making up games.

Q: So you as parents may have been outdoors more often than parents these days as well?

Monica: Oh yeah, I can remember we'd make up some morning tea and Jack would walk along the back creek with them...

Jack: Yeah through all the long grass over there...

Monica: ...and see how far they could go.

Q: With such a big family it would have been pretty exhausting for you both?

Jack: Oh yes. I didn't drink or anything then. And didn't go out except to work. I worked on the wharf full time and had a part time job at the local pub as well. So it was straight from work and back home and then into the family work as well.
