Dear Parents & Families,

Last Tuesday evening I had the pleasure of attending the Victorian Early Years Awards at the National Gallery of Victoria. The Kingsbury Playmap Project was shortlisted as one of three finalists from over 80 nominations for category of "Promoting Children's Health and Wellbeing Award", and I am very excited to say that the Kingsbury Playmap Project won the award!

The project, which was a pilot project for the City of Darebin, has now also been undertaken in 6 other areas and has now involved over 800 children and families in learning about where and how they can play in their local community. There are now plans to work in another 7 areas and build upon their learning throughout the process.

As part of their review of the project, the City of Darebin have developed a very simple survey that can be completed by children, adults, families, staff. This can be completed online at:



Supported Playgroups are FREE of charge, and families with children aged 0 to 4 can attend. They are provided by a trained playgroup Facilitator, and run during school term.

Supported Playgroups deliver the 'smalltalk' program where parenting essentials are discussed each week. Topics include:

- * being warm and gentle with your child
- * tuning in to your child by giving them your full attention
- * attending to whatever your child shows an interest in
- * listening and talking to your child
- * using teachable moments when they arise
- * shared reading.

Families may also be eligible for In Home Support, where the playgroup facilitator visits in the home for up to five visits.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To enrol, families must meet at least one of the below eligibility criteria:

- * a family member in the household holds a Health Care Card or equivalent
- * families in which a family member identifies as Aboriginal and/ or Torres Strait Islander
- * families looking after children in kinship care arrangements (out of home care)
- * families referred from Child FIRST/ Children Protection
- * families referred from or participating in Enhanced Maternal and Child Health Services.
