CSEF - CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURIONS FUND

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for primary school students.

Program Information

The Kingsbury Primary School Holiday Program offers high quality care and fun experiences during the holidays for children of Kingsbury Primary School and Our Lady of the Way School. Excursions and activities are organised and run by skilled and motivated educators.

- Holiday Program runs from 7:45am to 6:00pm.
- Breakfast club is open until 9:00am. Afternoon tea is provided at 4:00pm.
- Children must be registered with the program prior to their first day of attendance.
- Children must arrive at the program before the specified departure time on excursion days.
- Children are not to bring money with them to the program or on an excursion day.
- Staff are not responsible for electrical items or other toys brought into the program.
- For any emergencies during excursion times, contact 0429 120 953.

How to book places

Bookings for the Autumn Holiday Program can be made from Friday 22nd March. Please book as soon as possible.

- Step 1: For NEW families, please complete and return 2019 Enrolment Form, found on the Kingsbury Primary School website. From there, we will help you download and set up a My Family Lounge account.
- Step 2: Log in to the My Family Lounge app on your iPhone or Android. Select the 'Vacation Care' room on the Casual Booking Calendar and select the day/s you require.
- You're done! Confirmation of the booking will change the day from green to blue on the Casual Booking Calendar!

If you do not have access to My Family Lounge, please tick the days required on the form below and return to the program as soon as possible.

Regardless of the method of booking, a signed copy of the Excursion Permission Form (attached) must be provided to the program if your child is attending any excursions.

Please note that all information provided on My Family Lounge must be correct and up to date. Any changes to this information must be communicated with staff before the start of the Holiday Program. By booking your child/ren into the program you are agreeing with the terms and conditions displayed on My Family Lounge within the casual booking calendar.



- The base fee for Vacation Care is \$54 per day.
- Additional fees are applicable on certain days (see poster and/or booking form). These fees help to cover extra
 costs such as venue entry, buses and an increased Educator to child ratio which helps ensure high quality care
 and safety whilst out of school grounds.
- If you have not yet done so, families should contact Centrelink to find out If they are eligible for reduced fees under the **Child Care Subsidy System** and proceed with the necessary steps to apply.
- If you have received the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) in the past but have not attended the program for 8 weeks
 or more, please contact Jill at the program, as your child's enrolment must be confirmed once again to receive
 the CCS. Failure to do so will result in you being charged the full fee.

What to bring checklist

- Packed Lunch, morning snack and water bottle. Don't forget we are a Nut-Free Zone, so please ensure your child's snacks and lunches do not contain nuts or nut-containing products such as Nutella.
- Socks and enclosed footwear.
- A sun-smart hat.

- If not yet returned, your signed Excursion Permission Form.

Please note that during any warm days we may engage in water play activities to keep cool. Although we endeavor to do this only when the sun will quickly dry out clothes, it may be a good idea to pack a spare set of clothing and socks just in case. If you do not wish for your child to participate, please let a leader know on the day.

Little Sisters of the Poor: will be speaking at all masses next weekend, 6/7 April. They will be in the foyer after mass for further conversations.

A prayer form that is most often associated with the season of Lent, The Way of The Cross, is a prayer for all seasons. The idea of this prayer came from the ancient practice of pilgrimage. Some people would make this long journey to the Holy Land of foot, in search of the special graces, attached to the land where Jesus had walked. Obviously, this took considerable time and resources to accomplish and not everybody could make the journey. The aim of the journey was via Dolorosa, or the way of sadness, the way Jesus presumably took through Jerusalem to Calvary with the Cross. The Stations of the Cross became standardized over time, encompassing all the fourteen stops we have today.

Originally the franchise of the Stations of the Cross belong to the Franciscan Order, who were the guardians of the Holy Land. Today almost every Catholic Parish has a specially installed group of stations. By mediating on the stations, one can literally 'move' towards spiritual wholeness. We can use one of the many books that has been written by spiritual masters to accompany us along the way; or we can simply offer our own prayers as we go.

On Good Friday 1991, Pope John Paul 11 introduced an alternative way to pray the Stations of the Cross, foregoing some of the traditional scenes that are not found in the Bible: eg Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.

This new approach to the centuries old devotion allowed believers to engage in the mysteries of Jesus Passion, in a way that was based entirely on scripture. Though I grew up on the traditional stations, I've developed a great love for the scriptural stations. They not only help during difficult times, they help me to know Jesus better. They offer us 14 distinct ways Jesus responds to his suffering. It's also a guide to living a life with integrity and character. When Jesus was frightened what did he do? Freak out? Nope, he prayed. When he was tortured? He forgave. When he was abandoned by his friends? He accepted their flaws. He didn't condemn Peter when he denied him. No, he made him the rock of his church. Dying on the cross, Jesus didn't think of himself, he thought of his mother and his disciples.

From the Stations of the Cross, find a picture that resonates with a difficulty you might be experiencing now. Maybe you feel betrayed by a friend, so you pick a scene where Judas hand Jesus over to the Romans. Look at the image closely, look at the expressions on the faces of those present. Look at the background and see if you notice anything. Is there an angel near Jesus that symbolizes God's presence? Maybe a dark presence near Judas? Then close your eyes and picture yourself in that image. If you were Jesus how would you feel at that moment? Is your heart breaking or do you feel peace? Allow all those feelings to flow freely for a moment, then open your eyes, make the sign of the cross and carry that experience with you. Allow that sacred moment to guide you in your life.

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
