Kingsbury OSHC Winter 2019 Holiday Program Information Pack

Program Information

The Kingsbury Primary School Holiday Program offers high quality care and fun experiences during the holidays for children of Kingsbury Primary School and Our Lady of the Way School. Excursions and activities are organised and run by skilled and motivated educators.

- Holiday Program runs from **7:45am to 6:00pm.**
- Breakfast club is open **until 9:00am.** Afternoon tea is provided at 4:00pm.
- Children **must** be registered with the program prior to their first day of attendance.
- Children **must** arrive at the program before the specified departure time on excursion days.
- Children are **not** to bring money with them to the program or on an excursion day.
- Staff are **not** responsible for electrical items or other toys brought into the program.
- Management reserves the right to cancel a child's booking if their behaviour is deemed dangerous or unacceptable.
- For any emergencies during excursion times, contact 0429 120 953.

How to book places

Bookings for the Winter Holiday Program can be made from Wednesday the 12th of June. It is essential that bookings are made early to ensure resources, food, staff and venue entry can be organised. **To arrange a booking with less than** 24 hours of notice, you MUST first contact the Coordinator in person or via telephone to enquire about availability.

- **Step 1**: For **NEW** families, please complete and return 2019 Enrolment Form, found on the Kingsbury Primary School website. From there, we will help you download and set up a My Family Lounge account.
- **Step 2:** Log in to My Family Lounge on your desktop, iPhone or Android. Select the 'Vacation Care' room on the Casual Booking Calendar and select the day/s you require.
- You're done! Confirmation of the booking will change the day from green to blue on the Casual Booking Calendar!

If you do not have access to My Family Lounge, please tick the days required on the form below and return to the program as soon as possible.

Regardless of the method of booking, a signed copy of the Excursion Permission Form (attached) must be provided to the program if your child is attending any excursions.

Please note that all information provided on My Family Lounge must be correct and up to date. Any changes to this information must be communicated with staff before the start of the Holiday Program. By booking your child/ren into the program you are agreeing with the terms and conditions displayed on My Family Lounge within the casual booking calendar.

Fees

- The base rate for Vacation Care is **\$54 per day.**
- Additional fees are applicable on certain days (see poster and/or booking form). These fees help to cover extra costs such as venue entry, buses and an increased Educator to child ratio which helps to ensure high quality care and safety whilst out of school grounds.
- If you have not yet done so, families should contact Centrelink to find out if they are eligible for reduced fees under the **Child Care Subsidy System** and proceed with the necessary steps to apply.
- If you have received the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) in the past but have **not** attended the program for **8 weeks or more**, please contact the Coordinator, as your child's enrolment must be confirmed once again to receive the CCS. Failure to do so will result in you being charged the full fee.

Digital devices and technology

We understand that the holidays are a time for leisure, relaxation and fun and that, for many children, this involves time playing games on iPads and other devices. However, after careful consideration we have decided to enforce stricter rules regarding the use of personal devices and technology at the program. Not all children are fortunate enough to have their own device to bring along, and there have been occasions where this has caused tension and disappointment for some children. In addition to this, OSHC staff work hard to plan, prepare and run numerous activities throughout the day, and we hope these rules will help to maximise the children's involvement and social interaction whilst at the program.

If your child is interested in bringing a personal device with them to the program, please discuss with them the following rules:

- Children are allowed to bring a digital device such as an iPad or tablet to the program, but please remember that OSHC staff are **not** responsible if these items are damaged or lost.
- Children are responsible for bringing a charger or ensuring their device is fully charged when they bring it to the program.
- The use of personal devices and other technology is limited to 30 minutes in the morning (10:30-11:00am), and 30 minutes in the afternoon (3:30-4:00pm) on the 'technology table'. There may be opportunities to 'earn' additional time throughout the day.
- If children are caught viewing or playing inappropriate content, OSHC staff may confiscate the device and return it at the end of the day.

Thank you for your assistance and understanding of this matter. If you have any questions or concerns, please speak to the Coordinator.

What to bring checklist

- Packed lunch, morning snack and water bottle. Don't forget we do not allow nuts at our program, so please ensure your child's snacks and lunches do not contain nuts or nut-containing products such as Nutella.
- Socks and enclosed footwear.
- If not yet returned, your signed Excursion Permission Form.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) On School

Students with Disability

What is the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data?

Schools must now complete the *Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)* every year. It counts the number of students who receive additional adjustments or "help" at school because of a disability. The NCCD helps governments plan for the needs of students with disability.

Who is counted in the data collection?

To count a student in the NCCD, schools must think through some key questions:

- 1. Is the student getting help at school so that they can take part in education on the same basis as other students?
- 2. Is the help given because of a disability? The word 'disability' comes from the <u>Disability</u> <u>Discrimination Act 1992</u> (DDA) and it can include many students.
- 3. Has the school talked to you or your child about the help that they provide?
- 4. Has the school kept records about the help they provide, the student needs and the reasons that the student needs this help? The school will need to keep copies of tests, student work, assessments, records of meetings, medical reports or other paperwork and information about how the student's learning is moving along over time.

Once the school decides that the student should be counted in the NCCD, they then choose a disability group and one of four levels of help that has been given to the student.

What does the word 'disability' mean in the NCCD?

In the NCCD the word 'disability' comes from the <u>Disability Discrimination Act 1992</u> (DDA). There are four types of disability that the school can choose from: sensory, cognitive, social-emotional and physical.

Many students that need help at school can be counted in the NCCD. For example, students with learning problems, e.g. specific learning disability or reading difficulty (sometimes called dyslexia), health problems (e.g. epilepsy or diabetes), physical disability (e.g. cerebral palsy), vision/hearing loss and social-emotional problems (e.g. selective mutism, Autism Spectrum Disorder, anxiety).

Letters from doctors or specialists can be very helpful for schools as they plan how to support students with their learning. Schools do not need to have these letters before they can count a

student in NCCD. Teachers can use all that they know about the student's learning and the records that they have collected over time to decide if a student can be counted in the NCCD.

What sort of help does the school give students?

Students need different types of help at school. Some students need a little help sometimes while other students need a lot of help nearly all the time. The type of help given depends on the needs of the student. The help can include changes to the school buildings or grounds (e.g. ramps or things like special desks or chairs), extra teacher help in classes, special learning programs, changes to the work they give the student or extra adult help.

How will the NCCD be different this year?

All schools have been counting students in the NCCD since 2015. The government will use the NCCD data as part of the funding to schools.

What will the school need to know about my child for the NCCD?

Schools work together with families to understand the needs of each child. It is helpful if families give their child's teacher a copy of any letters or reports they have. The letters or reports will help the school understand the child and the help that they might need. Letters from doctors, psychologists, speech pathologists, doctor, and occupational therapists etc. can be very helpful for schools. These reports along with information that the teacher has (i.e. school based tests, your child's work and learning plans) helps the school to understand and meet your child's needs.

What happens to the NCCD data? Who will have the NCCD information?

Each school principal must check the NCCD data in August of each year. The school will give the information to the Catholic Education Office. The school will work with the Catholic Education Office to make sure that the NCCD data is OK before they give the data to the government. The government will not be given the names of any students or any letters or records. Please ask your school for their privacy policy if you need to know more.

Does the school need me to agree with them about counting my child in the NCCD?

Amendments were made to the <u>Australian Education Act 2013</u> and <u>Australian Education Regulation</u> <u>2013</u>. Schools do not need you to agree to let them count a child in the NCCD. You cannot ask the school not to count your child.

Where can I find out more?

Please contact your child's school if you have further questions about the NCCD and/or refer to the national <u>NCCD Portal</u>.
