

Reflection: Take, Thank, Break, Give.

At the last supper, which was really the Jewish Passover meal, Jesus gave us an action, a mime, a sacred ritual of the Eucharist for a community that would summarise his core and lasting message for the World. One to keep repeating until his return. This deep message was to slowly sink in until the church (those who follow Jesus the Christ) is fully ready to meet (Jesus Christ) and drink at the eternal wedding feast. I want you to note how the meal, and the metaphor are based in physically; the incarnation continued in the elements of the universe. Good stuff, and yet it has always been a scandal to overly spiritual people, starting at the very beginning (see John 6:60). This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it? The Eucharist, which means "thanksgiving" has four main aspects...
