Plenary Council news: Some parishioners have asked me how the Plenary Council journey is going. I can tell you they gathered last week to place questions in order and have advised the following:

Top five dioceses are: Brisbane, Melbourne, Wollongong, Sydney and Perth.

Every diocese made at least 35 individual submissions.

The highest numbers of group submission were received from Melbourne.

Around half the number of all individual respondents were female, with 30% male.

3701 men and 6219 women made submissions.

432 respondents preferred not to state their sex, while 2406 respondents did not answer the question. Total 12758.
