Dear Parents & Families,

Over the past three years our school has worked weekly with an Education Consultant - Marian Corsetti. The goal in working with Marian was to improve teacher capacity in the teaching of literacy and to improve student outcomes. Due to the dedication, hardworking, questioning and learning of our staff we achieved both outcomes successfully. Our Reading Naplan Data has consistently improved over the last three years and again we were recognised as being in the top 10% of Victorian Schools for improvement in Reading and consistently keeping this high standard. In 2020, we will not be working on a weekly basis with Marian and we would like to thank her for her knowledge and wisdom in guiding us through change and growth in the area of literacy over the past three years. Allison Luff and Huong Ngyuen will continue to take on the coaching role with the teachers and working within classes to continue our growth in our Literacy Data. Marian will return at planned times throughout the year to follow up with staff and discuss our progress.

One aspect of our literacy program for our junior classes is the wonderful work of our Parent Helpers. So again we will be running one afternoon session called a 'Refresher Training', for our Parents who have previously completed the full training. 'New Parent' helpers are required to undertake a 2 session program to establish how the Literacy Programs run in school and the role of the Parent in being a Literacy Helper. Further information is listed below.

PARENT HELPER REFRESHER TRAINING

All currently trained parent helpers who wish to assist in our Literacy Sessions in 2020 are required to attend a Refresher training session next Monday, February 17, from 2.00 – 3.30pm. Letters were sent home to all current approved helpers last week with details about the session.

NEW PARENT HELPER TRAINING

All new parents who wish to assist in our Literacy Sessions in 2020 are required to attend two training sessions. The first session, focusing on assisting children learning to Read and will be held on Monday February 24 from 2.00 – 3.20pm. The second session will focus on assisting children with learning to Write and will be held on Monday March 2 from 2.00 – 3.30pm. These sessions are for new parent helpers to the school who may wish to assist in the classroom in 2020.

As part of these sessions, we will also work with each parent to complete the necessary documentation to meet the Child Safe Standards. This will ensure that all our volunteers meet the standards under this new Ministerial Order. Please complete the response form attached to today's newsletter if you wish to be a New Parent Helper in 2020.

If Parents are unable to attend the Refresher or New Parent Training sessions in Term 1, a second round of sessions may be repeated later in Term 1 or Term 2 if numbers allow.

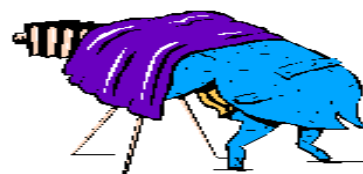

CSEF - CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for primary school students.

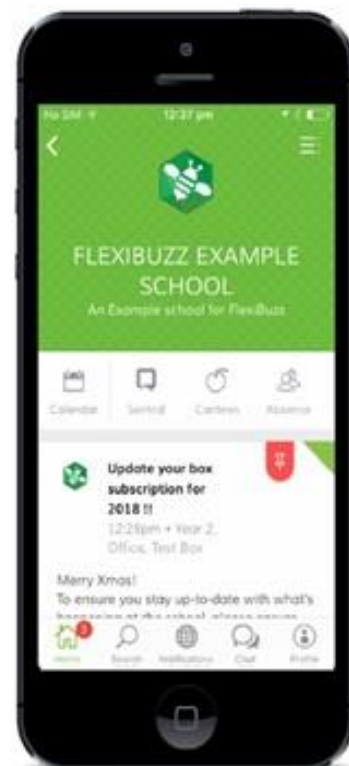

I also authorise the Australian Government Department of Human Services (DHS) to provide the results of that enquiry to DET.

I understand that:

- DHS will use information I have provided to DET to confirm my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund and will disclose to DET personal information including my name, address, payment and concession card type and status.
- this consent, once signed, remains valid while my child is enrolled at a registered Victorian school unless I withdraw it by contacting the school.
- I can obtain proof of my circumstances/details from DHS and provide it to DET so that my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund can be determined.
- if I withdraw my consent or do not alternatively provide proof of my circumstances/details, I may not be eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provided by DET.
- information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to the Victorian Department of Health and Human Services and /or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.

CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
 - on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
 - b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
 - c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see:

www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (28 January 2020) or term two (14 April 2020).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see:

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2020 closes on 26 June, 2020.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.



PAYING SCHOOL FEES ELECTRONICALLY

How does it work?

Direct Debiting allows the Catholic Development Fund (CDF), on behalf of your School, to deduct periodically from your account an agreed amount to cover your School Fees and Levies.

Benefits to You

CDF believes that this will assist families with the difficult task of budgeting for annual school fees and charges. One less major bill to worry about and it is free. It can save you time, money and hassles. No more problems with cheques left in school bags or the worry of sending cash.

Benefits to School

Transmission occurs automatically and is secure as no cash changes hands. The process of counting and banking funds will be greatly reduced, assisting school administration. CDF guarantees complete confidentiality on behalf of your School.

How to Apply

- Complete the attached Authorisation form (Part "A") and Direct Debit Request form.
- Sign both forms and return to the School office.
- The School will complete Part "B" and forward all completed forms to CDF (allow 14 days for CDF processing).

Variations

If you wish to alter the amount being transferred or cancel the authority, just advise your school.

Normal bank charges may apply, eg. dishonour fees if you have insufficient funds in your bank account.

(You will need to contact your bank or financial institution to establish if your account is suitable for direct debiting to occur. Credit card accounts and Passbook accounts are not suitable for direct debiting with CDF.)

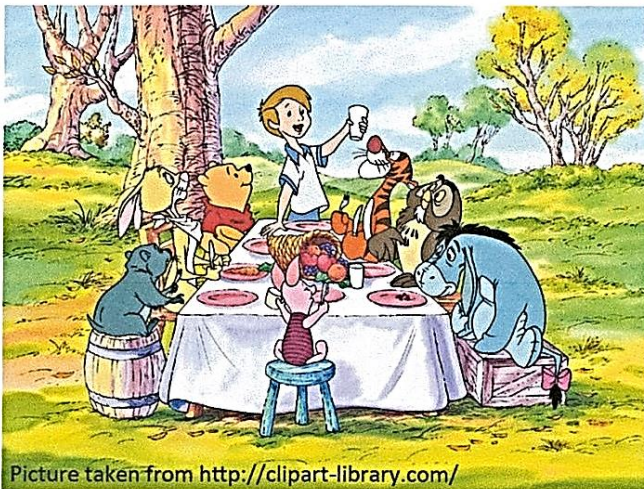
