Dear Parents & Families,

Thank you to our Prep - Year 2 families for assisting us with the smooth transition back to school last week. Our students have greatly enjoyed being back at school and it has been wonderful to see the progress that many have made whilst Learning from Home. Our preliminary assessments show that the students have made some great gains during this time!

Next Tuesday our Year 3 - 6 students return to onsite schooling. In order to manage the process of children in and out of school, there are some existing procedures we will maintain, and some we will modify to ensure a smooth transition at the beginning and the end of the school day. In particular:

- Only students are allowed on the school site.
- Students will assemble on a yellow dot at the black gates and will be temperature checked and hands sanitised prior to entry at the beginning of the school day.
- There is staggered entry and exit times to reduce gate congestion. From Tuesday June 9, students will be grouped in House Teams for this process as it keeps families together.
  - Entry -Bates - 8.30am 0 Kelly – 8.40am Latrobe – 8.50am
  - Exit -Bates – 3.10pm 0 Kelly – 3.20pm Latrobe – 3.30pm
- Staff will assemble students on the Basketball Court at the end of the day.
- Parents will wait outside the black gates on the yellow dots at their designated time. The Person in Charge will manage the dismissal from school.
- If you miss your time for collecting your child, then you will have to wait until other groups have cleared the school. Your child's teacher will remain with your child until they are collected.

• Additional cleaning routines in line with guidelines government have been implemented to ensure that we keep staff and students as safe as possible. A copy of the classroom teacher protocols is included in today's newsletter.

These arrangements new are operational until the end of Term 2 and we will need the support of all families to ensure that this is a safe and smooth process. Please do not wait around or congregate in the carpark, once you have collected your child/children, you need to leave directly.

Once a year level has returned, all students are expected to attend school. The school will continue to post work weekly on Sunday evening for students who are not able to attend school, but this ruling by the government means that if you choose to keep your child at home, you are responsible for their learning. Classroom email accounts will also be closed once a level has returned, so please contact the school office if you wish to speak with your child's class teacher.

Our final 'Wellbeing Wednesday' online catch-up is this Wednesday for Years 3 – 6. Class teachers in Years 3 – 6 will continue to be available online daily between 9.00am and 3.30pm until all classes have resumed on June 9.

# **COVID-19 RETURN TO SCHOOL PROTOCOLS**

### **START & END OF DAY**

- Students will enter and exit the school grounds at their designated class time. Students attending
  for supervision will enter with their P 2 sibling. From June 9, students will enter and exit
  according to their designated House Team time.
- Students will be temperature checked at the gate and sanitised prior to entry. They then move to their classroom and prepare for the start of the day. They are able to move outside to the playground to play prior to the commencement of the school day.
- From Tuesday May 26, Year P 2 classes and supervision students assemble on the basketball court at their designated time for dismissal.
- From Tuesday June 9, 2 members of the Leadership Team & 3 LSO's will manage the dismissal process. House Teams will assemble on the basketball court at their designated time for dismissal. Teachers will remain in their room supervising remaining students.

### **ENTERING & RETURNING TO THE CLASSROOM**

- Students are required to sanitise when entering the classroom/learning area. When leaving the classroom/learning area, students are also required to sanitise. If going to the toilet, they can wash their hands with soap and then return directly. If they are going to the office or another location, they need to sanitise on return.
- Each classroom/learning area has its own labelled bottle of sanitiser. These are refillable bottles so please do not throw them out.

### **BEFORE MORNING RECESS, LUNCHTIME & AFTERNOON DISMISSAL**

- Students will be required to assist with the cleaning regime. Additional time will need to be built into your day to plan for this.
- After eating morning tea or lunch and before leaving at the end of the day, the students will be required to clean their work area, chair, etc. The teacher will spray the student's desk and chair and the child will wipe down the desk and chair with the paper towel provided. This will then be thrown out and the child can sanitise their hands and be ready to leave.
- Staff will need to wipe down high touch areas (such as door handles, light switches, teacher desk, etc.) prior to exiting their room at each break.
- Students will need to wipe down devices when they are to be returned to charging stations. Huong will coordinate the distribution of wipes for devices.
- Each grade has a labelled spray bottle of cleaner/disinfectant. These are refillable bottles so please do not throw them out.

## STUDENTS USING THE TOILETS DURING RECESS TIMES

• Students attending the toilet during recess times will be able to sanitise at the Sanitiser Stations outside the toilets prior to entering, then was their hands with soap before leaving.

#### LINING UP AFTER RECESS & WET DAY

- Please separate out your grades so that there is adequate space between classes and students.
- For wet day duties, please do not allow students to move between classes and have them limit their movement within the classroom.

## LIMITING HIGH TOUCH SURFACES

- The toilet doors will be pinned open (excluding cubicle doors) to minimise touching.
- Keeping classroom doors open will reduce the need to constantly wipe handles and frame.
- Limiting movement of students within the classroom and shared use locations will reduce the need for constant cleaning.

#### **BOOK RETURNS**

• A tub will be provided for book returns. Books will need to be placed directly into the tub. Covers will need to be wiped down with disinfectant prior to re-shelving.

#### END OF DAY

• The playground, outdoor seats, tables and equipment will be disinfected daily by members of the Leadership Team. A mobile spray pack and hose are stored in the cleaner's room.
