Dear Parents & Families,

We are finalising our structures and classes for 2021 and have a number of children on our waiting list at different levels, so if your child is currently in Prep – Year 5 and will not be returning to OLW in 2021 could you please let us know as soon as possible. We have also received quite a few enrolments for Prep 2022, so if your child will be commencing in 2022, please download and complete and Enrolment Form from our website or collect an Enrolment Form from the office as soon as possible.

School Photos are tomorrow, Tuesday November 24. This year, we are also asking that all students wear their sports uniform on the day for the photos as we will be taking more casual photos of the students on the playground following our COVID Safe plan. Year 6 students will also need to bring their Commemorative Jumper for their Graduation photo. Please note that the correct uniform is house sports top, blue shorts, white socks and runners.

Attached to today's newsletter are instructions for how to order your child's photos. Please be aware that access to ordering photos will not be available until after the photo day, and your child will have a unique QR code or identifier so that you will be able to view their photos prior to ordering. No money or ordering is required prior to the day.

2021 FAMILY & LEVY FEES

School Fee for 2021 will be \$1700 per family and the levy will be \$400 per child. (\$50.00 will be refunded if families attend one working bee during the year). The annual rise in fees is kept to a minimum and in line with, or just below CPI, to ensure that OLW remains accessible for all families.

Please remember that if you ever have any concerns over the payment of school fees, you should contact the office so that we can assist you with managing your situation.

ordering and receiving these items at the school. You will not be required to order and books or texts.

COVID-19 restrictions have meant Sacramental that our program for Reconciliation, Communion and Confirmation for Years 2, 3 & 6 have been placed on hold for 2020. After consultation with the Year 6 families and Fr Terry, whilst we may have been able to confirm our Year 6 students at school, we have deferred the celebration of all Sacraments to 2021 when they can be celebrated with family, friends and the wider parish community. Dates will be set in 2021 when guidelines and protocols the numbers of attendees and on involvement in the celebration are eased.

Work on the framing for our deck that runs the entire length of the four classrooms under the covered area has progressed very well over the past week. We now have some initial boards in place at the carpenters work on their set out. Electrical rerouting has been finalised over the weekend and we are now in the process of preparing the brickwork repairs and the replastering of the walls and ceilings in the classrooms and corridor. The area should begin to take on a whole new appearance over the next two weeks!

Our next Education Board Meeting is this Wednesday, November 25, at 7.00pm. This will be an online meeting once again. Minutes and Agenda have been distributed through the school app.

We recently discovered that we have quite a few sweet potato fans in our group, and so this week we wanted to incorporate some into our afternoon tea. We decided to modify our popular zucchini slice recipe to make a sweet potato slice! Many of the kids thought it was delicious, and we think it would be a great recipe to try at home for lunch or dinner.


Ingredients

- 1 diced brown onion
- 200g diced bacon (optional)
- 7 eggs
- 1 cup self raising flour
- 3 cups grated sweet potato (about 500 grams) If you'd like to incorporate more greens, you could substitute half the sweet potato for zucchini
- 1/2 cup canola or rice bran oil
- 1 cup grated cheese

Directions

- Preheat your oven to 170 degrees Celcius
- Fry the onion and bacon in a pan until soft and lightly browned
- Sift the flour into a large bowl, then add the grated sweet potato, cheese and the cooked onion and bacon
- In a separate bowl or jug, whisk the eggs and oil until smooth, then pour into the dry mix
- Stir until all the ingredients are combined
- Pour the batter into a greased and lined baking dish, and bake for around 30-40 minutes, or until browned and a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean
- Cut into squares, and enjoy!
