You will need:

- five 6 sided dice
- paper
- pencil

Dead Dice Number 3

*Change dead dice number for each game or have more than 1.

Task: The first player rolls all 5 dice. If among the 5 dice, a 3 is not rolled the player adds all 5 number values together. If a 3 is rolled the player does not score. When a dead dice number is rolled, that dice is removed for that players next round. Player continue to roll until all dice are 'dead'. Highest total wins

eg:

Player 1 Player 2

1, 2, 2, 4, 5 (add total) 2, 3, 4, 4, 5 (1 dead dice)

1, 3, 3, 5, 6 (2 dead dice) 1, 3, 3, 3, (3 dead dice)

2, 2, 4, (add total) 2 (add total)

Play until all players have no dice left or best of 5 rounds.


