Dear Parents & Families,

Next Monday, May 24, we celebrate our school Feast Day. To celebrate this day, we will be holding a whole school Paraliturgy at 11.30am in the Church. Unfortunately, due to COVID restrictions, families will not able to join us in this celebration.

This year, May 24 also marks an important celebration for Catholic Education across all of Australia with the celebration of the Bicentenary of Catholic Education. 200 years ago Fr John Therry started the first Catholic school in Australia in Parramatta NSW with just 31 students. Today, there are 1,755 Catholic Schools with over 777,000 students and over 100.000 staff. To celebrate this day, our SRC will be coordinating with each class to put together some items for a time capsule that will show what OLW was like in 2021. This will then be buried in the by the garden bed Hall once the refurbishment is complete, with a bollard decorated by the SRC will mark the spot.
