Dear Parents & Families,

This Sunday we celebrate Mother's Day and usually we are able to hold some type of function in the Hall or in the celebrate classrooms to our mums. Unfortunately, this year our Hall is still under refurbishment and as we are still under COVID Safe guidelines, we are limited to the 1 person per 2m² rule indoors for classrooms. This means that we are not able to allow access to any parents into a classroom if the students are there as we would be in breach of the guidelines.

Therefore, we have decided that the best course of action at the current time is to run our Mother's Day Stall as usual and also have the students complete something special for their mum at school. Once our Hall is complete in around 4-6 weeks, we will hold a special Mum's Morning in the Hall as our first function in the new space.

MOTHER'S DAY STALL

Our P & F will be holding the Mother's Day Stall this Friday morning commencing at 9.15am. Gifts will be predominantly \$2, \$5 & \$10 with a wide selection on offer for those wishing to purchase a gift for their mum.

IXL & FLIPPED CLASSROOM

During Learning from Home in 2020, we learnt many new ways of changing up the student learning and how we can further enhance what is taught in the classroom. During Term 2 this year, we are going to trial what is sometimes referred to as the 'Flipped Classroom'. In simple terms, this refers to students undertaking new learning and concepts in the classroom and then practicing or revising these skills at home. This practice, using the IXL Program, will form part of their homework over the course of the week and give immediate feedback to the teacher on how well the student has retained their knowledge and new learnings. It will also enable parents to know what is being undertaken in the classroom in either Maths or English. The weekly homework contract will specify the exact exercises to be completed over the course of the week. In some cases, it may even be revision activities from the year below their current level in order to consolidate learning. Activities should not take any more than 5 – 10 minutes at any time and may be modified for students on PLP's or special programs, depending on their learning goals. User names and logins have remained the same for students in Years 1 – 6, but login information will be sent home by the classroom teacher for all students this week so that everyone can be set up and ready to go from next week.


WORD OF THE WEEK

MUSIC ACADEMY
