NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK

National Reconciliation Week in 2021 runs from May 27 - June 3. This year's theme is 'More Than a Word, Reconciliation takes action'. Last week the FIRE Carriers presented to each grade about Reconciliation Week. The Year P-2 read an Indigeneous story called 'Alfie's Big Wish' - a book about friendship. The Year 3-6 grades read 'Sorry Day'. Sorry Day explains about the Stolen generation of our Indigenous People. Following the learning from the book, each grade made an Aboriginal Bracelet using the colours of red/yellow/black of the Aborignial flag. Each class learnt that the yellow circle represents the sun, the red represents the red dust and earth and the black colour represents the Aboriginal People. The FIRE Carriers did an outstanding job helping students to realise that we need to learn about our past, say sorry so that we can reconcile, and then move forward as one in the future.

The program (which includes over 35 contact hours with specialist teachers per year) will run at a cost of \$570 per semester.
