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Dear Parents & Families,

Thank you for the work you have been doing with your children over the past week. We know that the uncertainty of how long students will be learning from home can be especially frustrating for some, everyone had hoped that this would just be a snap lockdown, so I think that it would timely to remind everyone to be kind to yourself and your family. The term 'lockdown fatigue' has been used quite a lot in the media recently, and many people are finding it difficult with juggling work, their children and family responsibilities, so things may not work out perfectly each day and that is okay. The most important thing is keep connected with each other in order to promote our wellbeing and resilience. We know that learning happens best when we feel good about ourselves.


WORD OF THE WEEK
