Dear Parents & Families,

As you would be aware, the Victorian Department of Health now strongly recommends that face masks are worn in indoor settings.

As a result, they are requesting all students aged 8 years and over to wear a mask when in class from now until to the end of winter. Students aren't required or expected to wear a mask when outdoors.

Therefore, families need to determine if they wish their child to wear a mask when indoors at school. We will encourage students to wear a mask where they have been provided by parents. In line with government mandates, students using public transport or ride share vehicles must wear a mask.

We will also continue to maintain our COVID Safe practices at school around hand hvaiene. additional cleaning routines. infection prevention and control, and social distancing to try and keep everyone as safe and well as possible.

RAT tests will be distributed 3 times throughout the term with all students receiving their new pack this week. Families who require additional RAT tests due their child being a 'close contact' can contact the school office to check on availability.

Please remember that students should continue to stay home if they are unwell, even if they test negative on a RAT.

Thank you to everyone for your ongoing support in keeping our school safe!

TERM 3 SCHOOL CLOSURE DAYS

OLW will be holding two Closure Days in Term 3. The first Closure Day will be on Monday August 15 which will be a professional practice day focussing on improving educational outcomes for students and compliance requirements. The MACS Executive Leadership Team have approved this additional pupil free day for all MACS Primary Schools in Term 3 as many schools struggle to employ CRT's to cover staff illness and attendance at Professional Development activities.

The second Closure Day will be held on Monday September 12. This day is the last Monday of Term 3 and is for Parent-Teacher Interviews. Further details about arrangements and booking an interview time will be released closer to the date.

OSH Care will offer a program on these days if sufficient families are interested in accessing the program.

The Living Word

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C

24 July 2022

First Reading Gn 18:20-32

Lord, do not be angry if I speak.

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.'

The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' The Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.'

Abraham replied, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this to my Lord, I who am dust and ashes. But perhaps the fifty just men lack five: will you destroy the whole city for five?' 'No', he replied 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five just men there.' Again Abraham said to him, 'Perhaps there will only be forty there.' 'I will not do it' he replied 'for the sake of the forty.'

Abraham said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry, but give me leave to speak: perhaps there will only be thirty there.' 'I will not do it' he replied if I find thirty there.' He said, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this, but perhaps there will only be twenty there.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the twenty.' He said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry if I speak once more: perhaps there will only be ten.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the ten.'

You have received the Spirit which makes us God's children,

and in that Spirit we call God our Father. Alleluia!

Gospel Lk 11:1-13

Ask, and it will be given to you.

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us.

And do not put us to the test."'

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.

'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'



Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

People often imagine huge distance between Earth and a Heaven beyond the horizon of the universe. But Jesus Christ taught us to pray 'Thy will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven.'

How can this come about? Jesus identified two areas on which we need to focus to help make Heaven and Earth share the same space.

'Give us this day our daily bread.' This petition is very real for most inhabitants of the world – a plea for the necessities of life to stave off real hunger. If we respond to this plea, we can change a Hellish situation to a place where Heaven and Earth coincide.

'Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.' But, first to Shakespeare: 'The quality of Mercy is not strained. It falleth as the gentle rain of Heaven on to the place beneath.'

If we develop a hardness of heart which refuses to show forgiveness, then we are like earth concreted over and are unable to absorb God's forgiveness into our own lives. When we forgive someone, we become more able to absorb the gentle rain of heavenly mercy and forgiveness.

So, Heaven and Earth need not be as distant as supposed. Our Lord has shown us how we can help make these dimensions of existence coincide.

We could take a moment to resolve to pray the 'Our Father' by our lives, helping to provide evidence for our acclamation:

'Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of Hosts,





t James was the son of Zebedee and the brother of John the apostle. He was a fisherman from Galilee who become known as James "the Greater" to distinguish him from the other apostle James "the Less", son of Alpheus. Jesus called James and John the "sons of thunder", most likely in reference to their quick-tempers. Along with Peter, James and John were among Jesus' closest friends and they were chosen to be witnesses to the Transfiguration and his agony in the garden. After Christ's death, James became the first apostle to be martyred when he was put to the sword by King Herod Agrippa I.
