PSG MEETINGS

PSG Meetings for students receiving educational adjustments are being held this Monday – Wednesday.

Each term, parents of students who have a PLP are required to have a PSG (Program Support Meeting) with their child's teacher to discuss goals and achievements of the student and to plan learning goals for the next term.

It is a requirement of our NCCD (National Consistent Collection of Data) that students on PLPs have a PSG each term, that minutes are taken of the meeting and that the PLP and minutes are signed by all present at the PSG.

As outlined in the Learning Diversity Policy, these meetings are required to be during school times so that key people and external professionals working with the child can be present. To meet government guidelines and retain funding, parents are required to attend meetings and sign off on the PLP and PSG

OLW Leadership meeting – minutes 27/5/22

1. Business from the minutes: Tony spoke about the data he had gathered about OLW parish; strength of the parish is the connections and inclusion it makes with a diverse range of people. Margaret reported her communications with Cath Garner, strategy coordinator, take the way of the gospel.
2. Fr Terry & Tony reported meeting Sr Anne who is looking for a parish position. We discussed the possibility of using Sr Anne or someone like her as an Administrator to fulfill the Sacristan's role and book priests. The school is growing in number with new families. Reaffirmed that our Parish Mission is to offer our Catholic Faith to the University and offer the Sacraments.
3. Christmas in July arrangements are under way. Glenda will be invited to attend the next leadership meeting to discuss the use of the hall.
4. Laminated signs need to be made for the toilet – "children need to have parent supervision" as per Child Safety requirements.
5. Synod of the Bishops – will travel to Rome; 9 themes for the Synthesis – one of these will be discussed by the leadership team next meeting.
6. The Parish School have had some discussion about a priest in the parish; 13 students for First Holy Communion and Confirmation; Liz suggested the Saturday night 6pm Mass be a young person's focus mass with youth or young children as readers; altar servers can be boys or girls and volunteers need to speak with Fr Terry.
7. The child Care Development is in the final stages with hopefully signed agreements finalised by the next meeting.
8. St Vinnies is looking for more volunteers.
9. Fr Dong from Bundoora Parish has been approached to partner with OLW parish but this will mean a change in the range of Masses offered at the parish or paying for other priests to offer other Masses.

19 June 2022

First Reading Gn 14:18-20

Melchizedek brought bread and wine.

Melchizedek king of Salem brought bread and wine; he was a priest of God Most High. He pronounced this blessing:

'Blessed be Abraham by God Most High, creator of heaven and earth, and blessed be God Most High for handing over your enemies to you.'

And Abraham gave him a tithe of everything.

Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming the death of the Lord.

This is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you: that on the same night that he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and he said, 'This is my body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me.' In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.' Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming to his death.

Gospel Lk 9:11-17

They all ate and were filled.

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing.

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.



Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

The feeding of the five thousand in today's Gospel is one of those anticipatory sharings in the heavenly banquet of the age to come.

We say this feeding is miraculous, and it was. A major part of the miracle is in the transformation of the Twelve. Our Lord did not personally feed the five thousand. He required his followers to get involved in alleviating hunger: 'You give them something to eat,' rather than leaving the crowd to fend for themselves, or resort to market economics. When they shared the food he had blessed, the miracle of the hospitality of God was multiplied throughout the crowd – extravagantly.

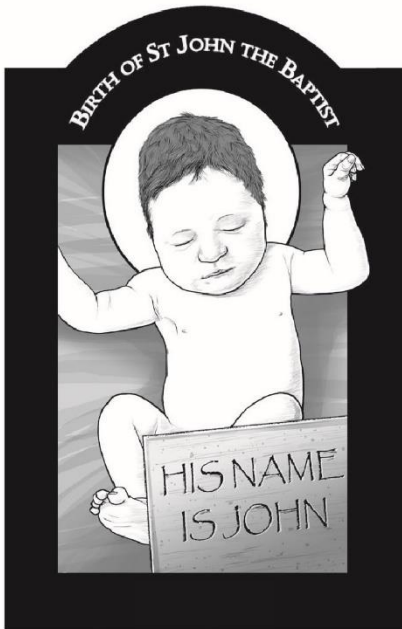
And so Our Lord gave his followers and the crowd a real taste of the future generosity of God in the heavenly banquet. But, it would not have happened had the inner groups of disciples not shared Jesus' vision and got involved in what seemed to be an impossible task.

The Last Supper was the greatest anticipatory meal which Our Lord shared with his disciples. And, at Mass, we are eating and drinking the glorified humanity of our Risen Lord Jesus Christ: the life of the future.

We could pause for a moment to identify the myriad of hungers in this world and resolve to fulfil Our Lord's Command: 'You give them something to eat!' so that Divine Mercy might transform human history.

The Nativity of St John the Baptist as told in the Gospel of Luke, begins with the Angel Gabriel appearing to John's father in the temple. Gabriel told Zachariah that his elderly wife Elizabeth was to have a son named John. When Zachariah left the temple he was unable to speak, for Gabriel had told Zachariah that he would be left mute until his son was born. After Elizabeth gave birth there was disagreement among the family's relatives over the naming of the baby. When they approached Zachariah he wrote, "His name is John". From that moment, Zachariah was able to speak again and he praised God and made a prophesy about John, saying: "You will be called the prophet of the Most High."

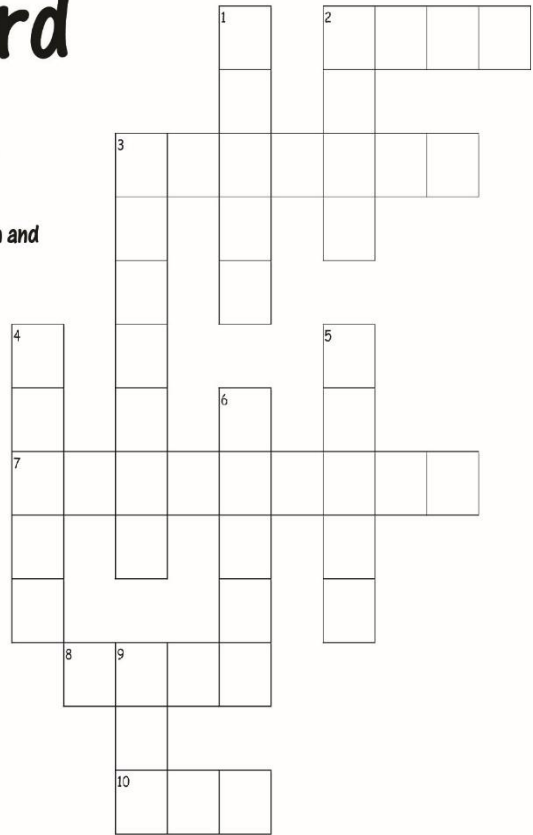
