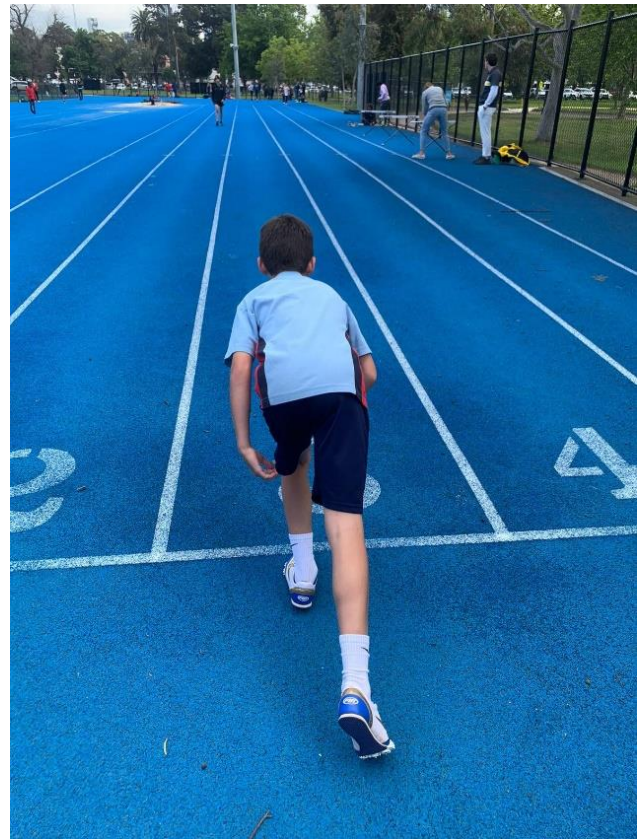
Congratulations to everyone who found out that 'jump on the bandwagon' means 'join others in doing or supporting something fashionable or likely to be successful'.

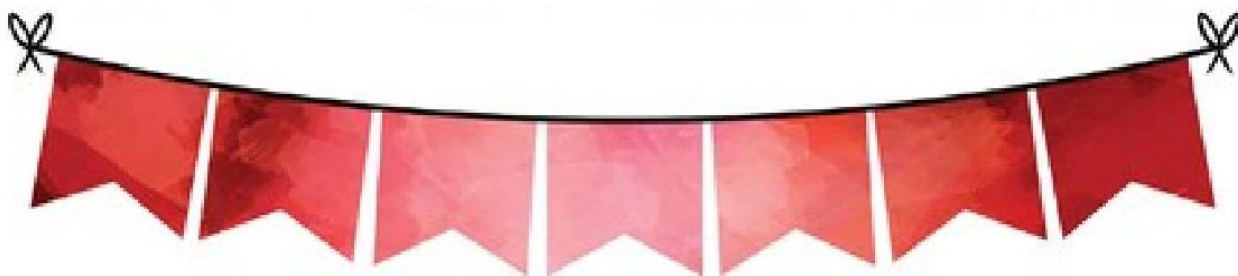

Recipe for Discipleship

Today recipes are more likely to be on a screen, and in a file, than on a recipe card in a wooden box. But the structure and layout haven't changed all that much. Recipes are ancient and the time-tested ones were handed down for generations. Traditional foods are one of the characteristics that identify cultures and religions.

The consistency of taste over time is because of the recipe. The early church had a recipe for discipleship. The struggles of a world with ever-present sin and inescapable death, were like a millstone. Conversion to Jesus Christ was the harvest of the ripened seeds of essential grains. The millstone may grind them up, but by the grace of God, they became a fine flour.

The flour was mixed with the waters of baptism, and the oil of gladness in sacramental anointing. A dash of salt as a preservative from evil, and the leaven of the gospels. The dough is kneaded by the loving hands of the Creator and let to rest to rise. The fire of the Holy Spirit transforms the dough into a loaf of bread. The bread of life comes down from heaven. While the bread of the last supper was unleavened and still is today, the recipe for discipleship needs the leaven of the Gospel. Wine is made from stomped grapes, and oil from crushed olives.

These sacramental elements testify to the mercy of God, who hears the cries of those in need. Our encounter with the person and real presence of Jesus Christ rebuilds what sin has torn down and feeds the soul.

Though we may be broken, stomped and crushed, we are partakers in the mystery of the body and blood of Jesus Christ, and anointed by the Holy Spirit with the oil of gladness. Bread is such a simple recipe, for such a profound mystery of faith. Yet as a fine flour, the waters of baptism and the oil of anointing prepare us to receive the Gospel. Prayer seasons us like salt and preserves us. We rest and rise ready for the fire of love in the Holy Spirit. As members of the mystical body of Christ, the church, we become transformed to be bread for the world. Fr Charles Lachowitzer.

The Living Word

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C

13 November 2022

First Reading Mal 3:19-20

The sun of righteousness will shine on you.

The day is coming now, burning like a furnace; and all the arrogant and the evil-doers will be like stubble. The day that is coming is going to burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, leaving them neither root nor stalk. But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays.

Second Reading 2 Thes 3:7-12

Do not give anyone food who refuses to work.

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow.

We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

Gospel Lk 21:5-19

Your endurance will win you your life.

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'



Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Our prayer can tell us a lot about the image of God we really have – holding a parking spot for us, or stopping rain on the second day of the Australian Open. But, if you were in Syria, your prayerful image of God would be as a Liberator from warfare, of a Saviour from Crimes against Humanity, of a Strengthened in time of torture and impending death.

In today's Gospel, Jesus promises his persecuted followers of every age, 'Your endurance will win your lives'. As Malachi prophesied: 'the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays'.

It is our faith that, out of the darkness of the tomb, the Son of righteousness did rise with healing in His rays, bathing the world with that light which makes the world habitable for human beings.

We could take a moment to pray for contemporary persecuted Christians that their faithful endurance will win their lives.

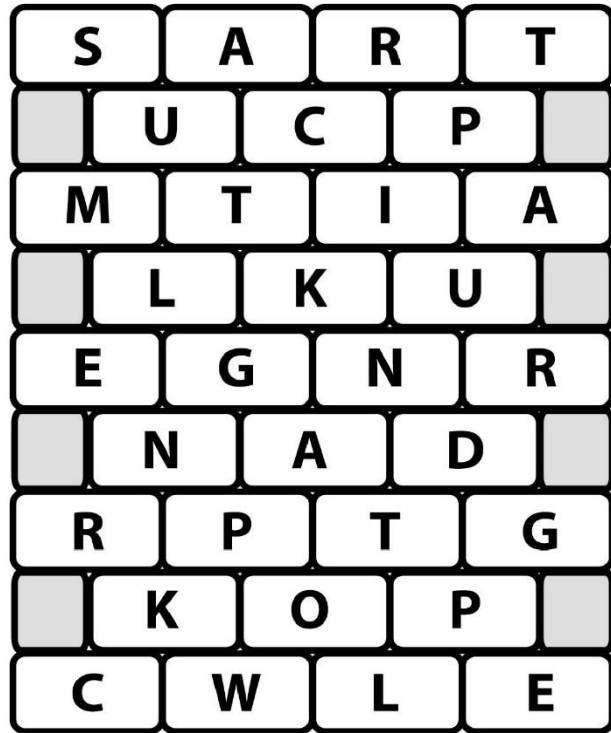

St Elizabeth of Hungary was the daughter of King Andrew II of Hungary. In 1221 she married Prince Louis of Thuringa at the age of thirteen. She built a hospital and cared for the sick herself, despite opposition from her family and the royal court. A legend arose that once when she was taking food to the poor, her husband stopped her and looked under her mantle to see what she was carrying, only to find that the food had miraculously been changed to roses. After the death of her husband, St Elizabeth was driven from the court by her brother-in-law after she refused to marry again. In 1228 she became a Franciscan tertiary and continued her work with the poor and sick, but after only a few years of austere living, she died at the early age of twenty four.

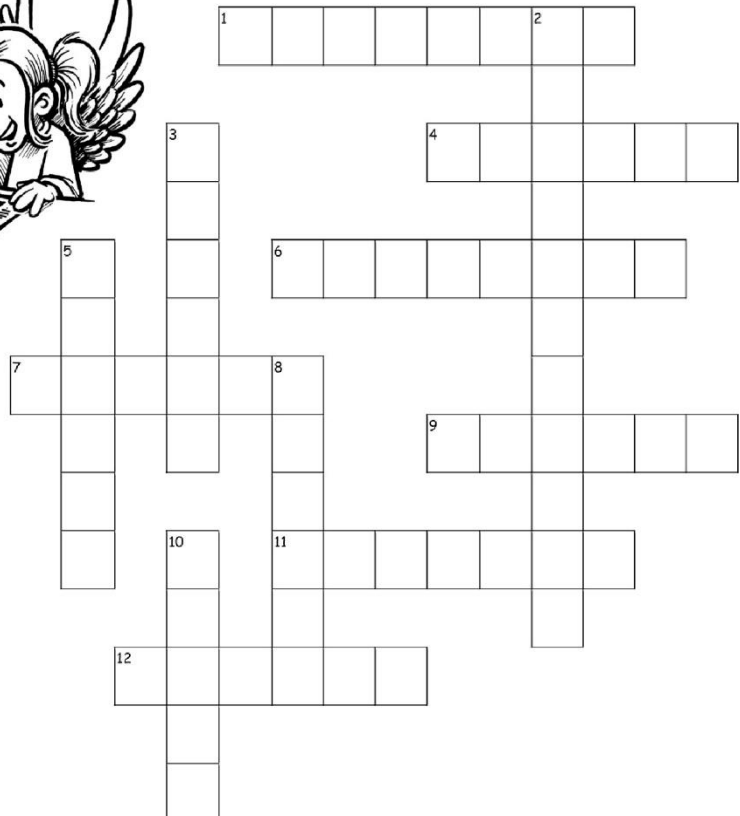

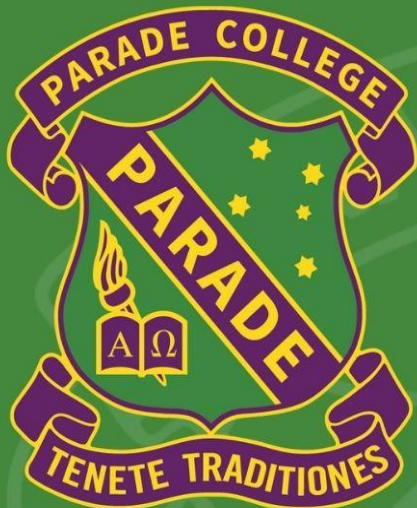

Recently around the first aid play table, some of the kids got into a conversation about snakes; what to do if you see one in the wild (stay still!), and how you would treat a snake bite if one was to occur (call 000 and wrap a bandage very tightly around the limb). Inspired by this, on Tuesday we created beautiful snakes out of salt dough. After shaping them into realistic slithering shapes, we painted them. It was interesting that, without instruction, many children painted using patterns, such as a mix of swirls and dots, that were reminiscent of traditional Aboriginal art and Dreamtime stories. As we crafted, the kids spoke about where they'll keep their snakes; some said they'll use them as a paperweight or decoration on their desks, while others said they'll keep them at the front door to ward off cats and potential robbers!

Other highlights from the past fortnight include playing lots of cricket (Thanh, Kyesha and Shaunak have demonstrated some excellent skills!), showing off ridiculous dance moves in "noodle dance tiggy" (especially Archer and Griffin), getting imaginative with magic potion making, and playing a big group game of memory tiggy!
