November - Remembering the Dead

Remembering the Dead has always been a part of the Catholic Tradition. And this remembering was usually associated with the celebration of the Mass. Mass was celebrated on the anniversary of each person's death. This practice was especially significant when it involved the death of martyrs; the celebration of their deaths was the beginning of the celebration of feast days of the saints.

The passage from this life to the life of the future, that is the life of the resurrection, was conceived on the model of the death of Jesus. His death was seen as a Passover through death into the new life of the resurrection. So, the death of the followers of Jesus was conceived as their sharing in his movement from this life to the Father.

As time and reflection went along, people became aware that there was still a need for some sort of purification for those who died. One of the ways of conceiving it was that they were being refined as metals were refined. The imagery of purifying fire entered the scene in such imagery; it also echoed some biblical imagery. Note that it was imagery! However, as one of the great historians writing about Purgatory says in the early Middle Ages, there was a riot of the imagination, and this purifying began to be conceived as a place of purification: what many of us would have heard about as Purgatory. (Even though in the old Catechism it was defined as 'a place or state of punishment' for those yet to be purified.)

Before such a conception arose, the basic imagery was that of a journey, which fits in better with the basic Christian idea of a passing over into the hands of God, which we saw above was the most basic way of imaging our 'going to God'. It echoes the words of Jesus on the cross: "Into your hands, I commit my spirit". So, the community of the Church prayed for the dead person who was completing their journey to God. They accompanied them on their journey in prayer and procession and in the celebration of the Eucharist. Over the next couple of weeks, we will tease out some of the themes touched above. The Living Word

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C

6 November 2022

First Reading 2 Mc 7:1-2, 9-14

The king of the world will receive us into life eternal at the resurrection.

There were seven brothers who were arrested with their mother. The king tried to force them to taste pig's flesh, which the Law forbids, by torturing them with whips and scourges. One of them, acting as spokesman for the others, said, 'What are you trying to find out from us? We are prepared to die rather than break the Law of our ancestors.'

With his last breath the second brother exclaimed, 'Inhuman fiend, you may discharge us from this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up, since it is for his laws that we die, to live again for ever.'

After him, they amused themselves with the third, who on being asked for his tongue promptly thrust it out and held out his hands, with these honourable words, 'It was heaven that gave me these limbs; for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again.' The king and his attendants were astounded at the young man's courage and his utter indifference to suffering.

When this one was dead they subjected the fourth to the same savage torture. When he neared his end he cried, 'Ours is the better choice, to meet death at men's hands, yet relying on God's promise that we shall be raised up by him; whereas for you there can be no resurrection, no new life.'

Finally, brothers, pray for us; pray that the Lord's message may spread quickly, and be received with honour as it was among you; and pray that we may be preserved from the interference of bigoted and evil people, for faith is not given to everyone. But the Lord is faithful, and he will give you strength and guard you from the evil one, and we, in the Lord, have every confidence that you are doing and will go on doing all that we tell you. May the Lord turn your hearts towards the love of God and the fortitude of Christ.

Gospel Acclamation Rv 1:5. 6

Alleluia, alleluia!

Jesus Christ is the firstborn of the dead; glory and kingship be his for ever and ever. Alleluia!

Gospel Lk 20:27-38 or shorter form Lk 20:27, 34-38

He is not a God of the dead but of the living.

Some Sadducees – those who say that there is no resurrection – approached Jesus and they put this question to him, 'Master, we have it from Moses in writing, that if a man's married brother dies childless, the man must marry the widow to raise up children for his brother. Well, then, there were seven brothers. The first, having married a wife, died childless. The second and then the third married the widow. And the same with all seven, they died leaving no children. Finally the woman herself died. Now, at the resurrection, to which of them will she be wife since she had been married to all seven?'

Jesus replied, 'The children of this world take wives and husbands, but those who are judged worthy of a place in the other world and in the resurrection from the dead do not marry because they can no longer die, for they are the same as the angels, and being children of the resurrection they are sons of God. And Moses himself implies that the dead rise again, in the passage about the bush where he calls the Lord the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob. Now he is God, not of the dead, but of the living, for to him all men are in fact alive.'

Billy Elliott was a boy brought up in a strife-torn mining town in the north of England. He discovered a passion for dancing. At an interview at the Royal Ballet School which was going badly, he was asked: 'What do you feel when you're dancing?'

'I've got fire in my body.' And he got the scholarship because the panel realised that when Billy danced, he became 'fully alive': bodymindspirit fully integrated. When Billy danced, everything that Billy was, was dancing.

That is what our Resurrection is all about. Our whole personality will be dancing with the radiance of Divine Fire coursing through our bodymindspirit. The Sadducees' small-minded sarcasm could not grasp that we will be bodies transfigured, translucent to divine light and energy.

We could take a moment to pray that, by the grace of God, our bodies will dance, enflamed by Divine Love.



EST LEO THE GREAT

t Leo the Great was the pope for twenty years from the year 440. During his pontificate he defended Rome from the barbarian conquerer, Atilla the Hun, by convincing him to accept tribute from the city rather than sacking it. St Leo's greatest triumph as pope came from the acceptance of his dogmatic letter, which taught that Jesus Christ is one Person, in whom both human and divine nature are permanently united. Almost one hundred of his letters and sermons still survive; he was declared a doctor of the church in 1754.
