Dear Parents & Families,

This week marks a very special and important time in our Church calendar, the beginning of Lent and the preparation of Easter. Tuesday is Shrove Tuesday; we often call this Pancake Tuesday as it was the day when Catholics fasted for Lent. Homes would empty their pantries of milk, flour and eggs to prepare for fasting during Lent. Another significant event on Shrove Tuesday is the burning of last year's palms to prepare the ashes for Ash Wednesday. This year Father Trac will preside over the burning of the palms Paraliturgy with our students at 2pm. During this ceremony, our 2023 Fire Carriers will be announced. Parents are welcome to attend the Paraliturgy that should only take 15 minutes.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent is on 22nd February. The school leaders will go to Mass at 10am and during the Mass Father Trac will bless and prepare the ashes that will be distributed to each class by their teacher in a class Paraliturgy.



SPORTING SCHOOLS PROGRAM

Sporting Schools Program in Term 1 will be Golf, commencing Tuesday February 28 for 6 weeks. The students who have missed out on the program this term will be put on a waiting list in case of a cancellation. These students will be considered for our Sporting Schools Program in Term 2. We are excited and looking forward to learning a new sport!

SCHOOL CHOIR

There has been an overwhelming response to students wanting to join the school choir. Mrs. Myers is ecstatic to see that over 60 students want to join. Choir practice will be on Tuesday afternoons. We look forward to hearing our students sing for us at our school events.

EASTER RAFFLE

The Term One fundraiser will be an Easter Raffle that will be drawn on Holy Thursday. The P & F are asking families for donations of Easter



chocolates only for our raffle. Donations of toys or other gifts will not be accepted for this raffle. A booklet of 10 raffle tickets will be sent home to families on Ash Wednesday. Each ticket will cost 50 cents. The money raised will go towards funding our Futurescapes/STEM program. We will be purchasing Makey Makey kits for the students to use this year.



POLICE VISIT

Last Monday at our assembly we had Constable Andy Morton from Reservoir Police visit our school to talk about the role of Police in keeping the peace in our community, 000, how and when to call 000, and the importance of knowing your full name and address in an emergency. He also spoke about Cyber Safety and how children can be kept safe when online. Constable Andy Morton will return later in the year to speak with our Year 3 – 6 students about Cyber Safety.

SCHOOL CLOSURE DAY



There will be a school closure on Tuesday March 14. This is the day after the Labour Day long weekend. As parents are aware, over the last few years we have

moved to be a Science of Reading/Science of Learning school. This has seen the teachers

change their practice to introduce Daily Reviews in all key learning areas, using the Cognitive Load Theory to plan lessons, and the introduction of InitialLit in Prep, Sounds Write Program in Year 1 & 2, and using MiniLit and MacqLit for reading intervention. OLW will join with three other schools as a Learning Collective where we have organised Dr. Lorraine Hammond AM and Associate Professor at Edith Cowan University WA to do a further deep dive into Daily Reviews with our staff. Over the coming weeks in the newsletter, we will inform parents further about what we teach and why we teach this way to improve student performance.

Newsletter Information on 7th Sunday – 18 and 19 February 2023 Looking into the Mass:

What are we, the People of God, doing at Mass? We are being the People of God!

We are taking up the means that Christ has left to us to enter into contact and communion with him! The two greatest things that he has left us are his words and the Eucharist. It is by listening to and hearing those words and by celebrating the Eucharist that we are able to continue to be his disciples.

When we celebrate the Liturgy of the Word, we are entering into dialogue with him. We are not just being instructed or given moral principles. We are putting ourselves in the shoes of those people who originally heard his words. If we take up any of the gospels, we will find that for the most part they are telling us about Jesus' contacts with the many and various people of his time. He interacts with Peter and James and John etc., he interacts with blind people, with crippled people, with religious people who disagree with him and so on. It is really helpful to take up a gospel and see what goes on between him and the people around him.

Fundamentally this is what we are seeking to do in the Liturgy of the Word. We are placing ourselves before him and letting him say to us what he said to those people in his time. And as they entered into a process of coming to grasp what he had to say so that is what we are called to be doing.

And so it is crucial that we listen or read not only the words of the gospels but also listen to our honest and immediate reactions to those words. This involves us in a dialogue with Christ! So we ought never neglect what arises in our hearts at the hearing of his words, be those reactions positive or negative or are seemingly indifferent. Such reactions are the beginning of his word having its interior effects within us.

The Word of God being proclaimed to us now is one of the ways in which the Christ whom we cannot see is making himself present to us.

We then move on to celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist, in which we also celebrate his continuing risen presence with us.

The Living Word

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A

First Reading Lv 19:1-2. 17-18

You must love your neighbour, as yourself.

The Lord spoke to Moses; he said: 'Speak to the whole community of the sons of Israel and say to them: "Be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy.

"You must not bear hatred for your brother in your heart. You must openly tell him, your neighbour, of his offence; this way you will not take a sin upon yourself. You must not exact vengeance, nor must you bear a grudge against the children of your people. You must love your neighbour as yourself. I am the Lord."

Responsorial Psalm

Ps 102:1-4. 8. 10. 12-13. R. v.8

(R.) The Lord is kind and merciful.

- My soul, give thanks to the Lord, all my being, bless his holy name. My soul, give thanks to the Lord and never forget all his blessings. (R.)

Second Reading 1 Cor 3:16-23

All things are yours, but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.

Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

Make no mistake about it: if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? Because the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. As scripture says: The Lord knows wise men's thoughts: he knows how useless they are, or again: God is not convinced by the arguments of the wise. So there is nothing to boast about in anything human: Paul, Apollos, Cephas, the world, life and death, the present and the future, are all your servants; but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.

Gospel Acclamation 1 Jn 2:5

Alleluia, alleluia! Whoever keeps the word of Christ, grows perfect in the love of God. Alleluia!

Gospel Mt 5:38-48

Love your enemies.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'

Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

'Be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect.' Is Jesus advocating rather static fault-lessness? Not very appealing! No, the Greek word is closer to the idea of a perfect wine – one that has matured and has reached its full potential. So, Our Lord is saying, 'Be a person who is everything you are capable of being.'

Our Lord gives a striking example of the challenge. God does not withhold life-giving sun and rain from people because they are bad or dishonest, nor extinguish the life of human beings because they are evil, because they are enemies.

What are the implications for Church teaching on capital punishment or warfare? Note that Jesus' command: 'You must be ... ' is directed to You in the plural. It is communal, social. The Church community must listen. Is the Holy Spirit moving us in a direction not experienced since its first three centuries?

We could pause for a moment to pray on behalf of those who want to do us harm, the better to hear: 'Blessed are the peacemakers.'

S t Polycarp was converted to Christianity by St John the Apostle and became an important leader throughout western Asia Minor as the Bishop of Smyrna.
