NAPLAN

Naplan begins on Wednesday 15th March to Monday 27th March. Our year 3 & 5 students will be completing Naplan. All Naplan tests are completed online except for Year 3 writing, this is handwritten. NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students take in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. NAPLAN is earlier this year, the aim is for schools and parents to be able to receive results earlier in the year.

SCHOOL CLOSURE DAY



Just a reminder that OLW has a school closure day on Tuesday 14th March after the Labour Day long weekend. This week I will focus on Daily

Reviews. Daily Reviews are a part of Barak Rosenshine Principles of Instructions. These ten Principles outline the evidence of how to teach a lesson. Daily Reviews are one component of Barak Rosenshine's Principles of Instruction. Daily reviews strengthen previous learning and can lead to fluent recall. The most effective teachers in the studies of classroom instruction understand the importance of practice. All of our classes at OLW begin their reading, vocabulary writing, spelling and maths lessons with a five to eight minute review of previously covered materials. Daily Reviews help students learning go from their short-term memory into their longterm memory. Our students each have their own mini-whiteboards and whiteboard markers and they use these when completing their Daily Reviews. When students are asked to write a sentence using the vocabulary explicitly taught, spell a word using the phonic structure they have been taught or solve a maths problem, they use their whiteboards. We always cater for our high performing students so they are challenged in all curriculum areas daily. Our staff is looking forward to learning from Lorraine Hammond as she delves into a deeper dive of Daily Reviews.

Find out its meaning and see if you can add this phrase to your vocabulary over the next week.



Newsletter Information on 2nd Sunday of Lent – 04 and 05 March 2023 Looking into the Mass:

The Mass is Ours!

"At Mass or the Lord's Supper the People of God are called together, with a priest presiding and acting in the person of Christ, to celebrate the memorial of the Lord or Eucharistic Sacrifice"

These words come from the initial description of the Mass given in the official document at the beginning of the Roman Missal. This description has been carefully worded to bring out an aspect of the Mass which was sorely neglected in the Missal that we used before the Second Vatican Council.

In that earlier Missal, the Mass was described only in terms of what the priest did. In fact, the people got only one mention in all the layout of the Mass.

What had happened over the course of several centuries and for several historical reasons was that the Mass had come to be seen as the priest's business rather than that of the whole gathered community of faith.

In the description above, the priest's core role is specified in terms of presiding and acting in the person of Christ, but the subject of the celebration is the whole community. And it is the whole community which is being drawn into communion with Christ which is the ultimate meaning and purpose of the Mass.

The gathered people are not second-class citizens, they are gathered there to be drawn more deeply into the body of Christ, the Church. The priest is there to serve that greater meaning and purpose in his unique ministry.

Again, it is worth drawing attention to the fact that the priest does not pray as if it is his prayer. He is always ministering to the community and so all the prayers of the liturgy are prayer in the first-person plural: "WE". The priest serves the prayer of the whole gathered community of faith.

First Reading Gn 12:1-4

When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'





Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

We have to get rid of the idea that the soul is a dot of energy in some hidden core of our body. In fact, the body is in the soul. There is no part of my body which is not immersed in my soul. It is my whole person, bodysoul, which needs to be saved. As Thomas Aquinas says: 'If only my soul is saved, I am not saved.'

Today's Gospel does not portray an out-of-body experience of religious ecstasy. Jesus' body translucent, totally radiant with Divine Light. Further, transfiguration was not a solitary experience for Jesus. Peter, James and John witnessed it precisely because it told them what our Heavenly Father desired as their destiny beyond martyrdom, if only they would listen to Jesus.

Heavenly salvation will involve my whole person, bodysoul, being transformed. But could a person, during their earthly existence, share in the transfiguration experience of Christ?

We could pause for a moment to 'Google' or otherwise get hold of my favourite story of a saint – St Seraphim of Sarov – and pray that we may share with his disciple the bodily experience of 'immeasurable wellbeing' – 'infinite joy in our hearts'.
