Dear Parents,

Last week we received our schools NAPLAN results for 2023. Our results have been consistently improving since 2021! Our Year 5 students 2023 are our highest achieving students

in our school's history. This is a remarkable accomplishment and reflects the dedication and hard work of both students and teachers.



When you receive your child's NAPLAN result you will notice a new grading system of Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs Attention. This new grading system replaces the bands from previous years.

NAPLAN results can be an important measure of a school's academic performance, but it's also essential to recognise that they are just one snapshot of



students' abilities on a particular day. It's important to note that OLW will continue to use these results as a benchmark to drive continuous improvement.



Continuing to exceed expectations in NAPLAN results indicates that the school's strategies, curriculum, and teaching methods are effectively supporting student learning and

growth. As an educator or a member of the school community, it's essential to celebrate these successes and continue refining educational approaches to ensure the continued progress of students.

Remember, while NAPLAN results are valuable, they are not the sole indicator of a school's overall performance. Other factors, such as student well-

being, engagement, and a well-rounded education, should also be considered to create a comprehensive



picture of the school's success. We will keep up the excellent work and focus on providing a nurturing and supportive learning environment for the students' holistic development.

The Value of Money (Inspiring Short Story about Self-Worth)

At the beginning of a new school year, a class teacher stands up in front of her students holding a \$100 bill.

First Reading Wis 12:13.16-19

In the place of sin, you give repentance.

There is no god, other than you, who cares for everything.

to whom you might have to prove that you never judged unjustly.

Gospel Mt 13:24-43 (or shorter form Mt 13:24-30)

Let them grow together until the harvest.

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn.

He put another parable before them, 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the biggest shrub of all and becomes a tree so that the birds of the air come and shelter in its branches.'


He told them another parable, 'The kingdom of heaven is like the yeast a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour till it was leavened all through.'

In all this Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed, he would never speak to them except in parables. This was to fulfill the prophecy:

I will speak to you in parables and expound things hidden since the foundation of the world.

Then, leaving the crowds, he went to the house; and his disciples came to him and said, 'Explain the parable about the darnel in the field to us." He said in reply, 'The sower of the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world; the good seed is the subjects of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects of the evil one: the enemy who sowed them, the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; the reapers are the angels. Well then, just as the darnel is gathered up and burnt in the fire, so it will be at the end of time. The Son of Man will send his angels and they will gather out of his kingdom all things that provoke offences and all who do evil, and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth. Then the virtuous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Listen, anyone who has ears!'


Perhaps accentuated by the constant messaging of social media, when trying to pray we can get anxious when there is a lull in the noise and no words come.
