Dear Parents & Families,

Everyone has now settled into a good daily school routine and it has been great to see our school leaders are stepping up into their roles and striving to achieve new goals.

ASH WEDNESDAY

This Wednesday, February 14, is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. The Season of Lent is the 40 days prior to Easter (Sundays are not included in the count) and is a time of preparation for the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday.

Ash Wednesday is the day for us to take stock of our lives and we are encouraged to attend Mass in order to mark the beginning of the Lenten season. As Lent begins, we should set out specific goals we would like to reach before Easter and decide how we will pursue them—for instance receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

To celebrate the beginning of Lent all students from Year 1 to Year 6 will attend Mass Ash Wednesday at 10:30am. All parents and family members are warmly invited to attend this special celebration.

During the liturgy, the ashes, which give Ash Wednesday its name, will be distributed. The ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous year. While the ashes symbolize penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts.

The distribution of ashes is a tangible reminder of our own need to focus on being better people. Through acts of penance comes a change of heart – a coming back to God. Date: Monday February 12 2024

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SOLAR Lab Professional Learning program in schools

Parent/carer information sheet

The Australian Education Research Organisation (AERO) and the Science of Language and Reading (SOLAR) Lab at La Trobe University, are conducting a research project to understand how to best support educators to implement explicit and systematic reading instruction in the early years (Foundation to Year 2), and ultimately, to improve students' proficiency in reading. The project involves providing teachers, teaching support staff and leaders with online professional learning in the science of reading and in the use of explicit and systematic early reading instruction and examining changes in teaching practice and students' reading achievement over time. Some schools will also participate in coaching activities. Overall, this project will provide important information about how best to support schools to adopt high-quality reading instruction in the early years for the benefit of teachers, students and whole-school communities.

Although AERO and SOLAR Lab have received permission from your school's Principal to contact you about this project, your child(ren)'s participation is **voluntary**. Please read this information carefully and ask any questions that you may have. We also ask that you discuss the project with your child(ren) and what participation means for them.

AERO and the SOLAR Lab will collect data on students' literacy progress

We aim to measure any changes in students' literacy progress that might be associated with the training teachers receive to investigate if the training program is working well.

Your child(ren)'s teacher regularly uses assessments of their students' reading to help them plan lessons and respond to your child(ren)'s educational needs. Your child(ren)'s school will be using the following reading and spelling assessments:

- Progressive Achievement Test (PAT) Reading
- Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS)
- Phonics Screening Check
- Diagnostic Spelling Test nonwords (DISTn)
- Diagnostic Spelling Test Spelling sounds to Dictation (DISTs)

We have chosen these reading and spelling assessments because they are already used by many primary schools across Victoria and may already be used in your child(ren)'s school. Students participating in the project will not complete any additional assessments compared to others in their class who do not participate.

With your permission, your child(ren)'s reading and spelling assessment data collected during the project will be shared with AERO and the SOLAR Lab to include in our analysis. This project will focus on children in Foundation – Year 2 and run over two years from 2024 to 2025.

Anticipated benefits and risks/burdens of participating

Findings will enable guidance on how to make professional learning work best in the Australian school context which will help leaders who are planning and/or designing professional learning to ensure the learning translates to improvements in teaching practice.

An anticipated benefit of your child(ren) participating in this project is improving your school's knowledge, confidence and use of evidence-based structured literacy teaching practices.

It is never possible to guarantee "zero risk" in research but we think the risks in this study are very low. If you experience something that you aren't sure about, please contact us immediately so we can discuss the best way to manage your concerns.

AERO intends to publish and report the results of this evaluation on its website. The publication of content on AERO's website, except where otherwise noted, is freely available to the public under the <u>Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 International Licence</u>.

AERO will use and store your child(ren)'s data responsibly

Any information AERO collects during the evaluation will be confidential, will only be used for the purposes described, and it will be stored according to our <u>Privacy policy</u> (updates forthcoming to reflect data is stored in Australian-based servers except where agreed otherwise). AERO will record and store all information in a secure facility in encrypted form on Australian-located servers for at least 7 years after completion of the project. Data will be disposed of securely when it is no longer needed – in keeping with national research standards and Australian Privacy Principles.

Identifying information will be removed from student data before it is shared with the research team. Each student will be allocated an alphanumeric code so their data can be tracked over time. Original assessment forms will remain at your child's school. No participants will be identifiable in any research outputs that are produced from this evaluation without explicit consent to do so. We will only share information about your child(ren) with your permission. Other than where required by law, only personnel working on this project will have access to personal information collected for this evaluation.

You can decline or withdraw consent

Your child(ren)'s participation in this evaluation is **voluntary**. Your decision (either way) for your child to participate will not in any way affect their relationship with AERO, the SOLAR Lab or their school. If you decline, your child(ren) will not be disadvantaged or penalised. If you initially provide consent to take part, you can withdraw at any stage without reason or consequence. However, because data will be deidentified it may not be possible to remove your child(ren)'s data from the evaluation once it is shared with AERO. **To withdraw**, please write to us at <u>AEROstudies@edresearch.edu.au or phone us on 0499164 694</u>. Please note, if you decline, data will still be collected by schools as part of business-as-usual practices, but it will not be passed on to AERO or La Trobe for research purposes.

First Reading Lv 13:1-2. 44-46

As long as he is unclean, he must live alone, outside the camp.

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.

'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean". As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart: he must live outside the camp.'

Alleluia, alleluia!

A great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people. Alleluia!

Gospel Mk 1:40-45

The leprosy left him and he was cured.

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees: 'If you want to' he said 'you can cure me.' Feeling sorry for him. Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. 'Of course I want to!' he said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.

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Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Lepers were social outcasts forced to live outside the villages and towns. Jesus heals the leper, allowing him to return to communal living, but, in touching him, Jesus put himself on the outer. The Gospel says that Jesus 'had to stay outside where nobody lived'. Jesus willingly changed places with the leper!

This incident prefigures the deepest mystery and scandal of the Gospel. Because of our deliberate wrongdoing, we are 'on the outside' with God. Our Lord and Saviour willingly experienced that alienation on Calvary, outside the walls of Jerusalem, in a desolate place where no-body lived. He suffered the dis-locating consequences of sin in his body and mind: 'My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?'

He took our place outside the human awareness of the loving presence of His Heavenly Father so that we might be located in the right place, *insiders* with God.

We might pause for a moment to lovingly thank our Saviour for leading us into 'the One in Whom we live and move and have our being'.

FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE: INFORMATION OF PARISHIONERS LENT 2024

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat.

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

(a) Prayer - for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary; or in other ways.

(b) Self-Denial - for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere; or in other ways. Project Compassion is a major means of expressing our self-denial in Australia.

(c) Helping Others - for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or over- burdened, or in other ways.

- All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain (Canon 1252).
- The Season of Lent is a time of penance. During this season the faithful are exhorted to devote themselves in a special manner to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, and to deny themselves.
- Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled between Ash Wednesday, 14 February 2024 and Trinity Sunday, 26 May 2024 unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time during the year.
- The wonderful gift of the Lord's merciful love is offered in a special way in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Lent is a most appropriate time to receive this Sacrament.
- All the faithful who have reached the age of discretion are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year.
