Dear Parents & Families, BULLYING NO WAY - NATIONAL WEEK OF ACTION

The theme for 2024 is 'Everyone belongs'.

When we all feel like we belong, bullying struggles to find a place. It is about embracing who we are, respecting everyone's differences, and standing up together against unkindness.

Belonging means we all have a role in preventing bullying. We are encouraged to speak up and create a safe place where everyone feels supported and respected and our voices are heard and valued.

As part of this week, we are hosting a NEDS Growth Mindset Incursion for the whole school. Students will discover how to activate their growth mindset to overcome social, emotional and academic challenges with three key messages:

School Advisory Councils do not have a legal identity and do not become involved in the day-to-day management of the school. The School Advisory Council must act within the parameters of this Terms of Reference. The MACS board, as the governing body of MACS schools, is responsible for the common good of Catholic education in MACS schools in the Archdiocese.

The following is a list of some of the key qualities and skills for members of the School Advisory Council:

- commitment to the MACS Statement of Mission
- commitment to Catholic education in the parish and school
- commitment to the vision and mission of the parish and school
- understanding of the role of parish priest as the custodian of mission, principal as the leader of the school and council members
- willingness to ask questions and seek clarification
- · ability to think strategically
- willingness to support the contributions of other council members
- capacity to listen in an active and meaningful way
- willingness to work cooperatively with others
- commitment to maintaining confidentiality at all times

The OLW School Advisory Council currently meets six times during the year and may call extraordinary meetings if required.

Expressions of interest to become a council member are to be made in writing and forwarded to the Principal. Anyone interested in becoming a member of the Our Lady of the Way Kingsbury School Advisory Council may seek advice from the principal, chair or parish priest on the process of appointment. Consideration will also be given to succession planning through staggered renewal of members to ensure continuing institutional memory.

Statement from Archbishop Peter A Comensoli on prayer in Parliament

It is pleasing that both major political parties in Victoria are now agreed on retaining the practice of reciting the Lord's Prayer in the Victorian Parliament each sitting day. This is a great outcome, which shows the value of people of faith standing up respectfully and being heard. Following the letter to parliamentarians that I signed together with religious leaders of various faiths in May, nearly 11,000 people from communities across Victoria signed a petition calling on Parliament not to remove the Lord's Prayer. Many others also wrote letters and emails to their local members of Parliament sharing their support. It was clear from the debate that the message about the importance of the Lord's Prayer and its value to the community was heard loud and clear. *Archbishop Peter A Comensoli*

Archbishop's Campaign

In 2024, the Archdiocesan Development Office is introducing a streamlined approach to fundraising. This approach, called the Archbishop's Campaign, is a single annual campaign and will reduce the number of separate special Sunday plate collections in parishes each year. The focus of the 2024 campaign is support for the formation of new priests and for the care of retired priests—those who have served the community of faith in the past and those who will do so in the future.



- Tax-deductible donations go to the Archbishop's Charitable Fund, which supports Corpus Christi College Building Fund, Priests Retirement Foundation, John Pierce Centre, Melbourne Overseas Mission, University of Divinity Building Fund and other deductible gift recipient entities such as Catholic community agencies and service organisations.
- Non-deductible donations go to Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne Religious Projects Fund, which supports seminarian formation and evangelisation initiatives such as World Youth Day. Any unallocated and loose collections will go to Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne Religious Projects Fund. When will it happen? The Archbishop's Campaign will run over three weekends each August. Officially announced to parishioners across the Archdiocese on 10 and 11 August.
- On 17 and 18 August, churchgoing Catholics will be asked during weekend Masses to make a donation through provided envelopes either as a once off or by monthly contributions or by simple donation to the Archbishop's Campaign. On the third weekend, 24 and 25 August, parishioners will be reminded to finalise their contributions. Brochures available in the Foyer.

Strengthened by the food, he walked to the mountain of the Lord.

He ate and drank and then lay down again. But the angel of the Lord came back a second time and touched him and said, 'Get up and eat, or the journey will be too long for you.' Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Your mother and my mother, carrying her baby in the womb for nine months, effectively said: 'Take, eat, this is my body.' A mother able to breastfeed continues this communion as she offers her body to give life to her child.

Our Lord Jesus Christ adopts maternal language to express his deepest desire for us! He gives us his risen and glorified Humanity: 'Take, eat, this is my body', and a sort of life-giving mutual indwelling occurs: 'Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me and I in them.' This is as intimate as a baby dwelling in the womb of its mother. As St Paul put it in a different context, 'In Him we live and move and have our being.'

The Saviour of the World, the Conqueror of Death, dwells in my body and I dwell in his glorified body. This gives us 'eternal life' which is not something which begins after death, but is simply a label for Our Lord's Divinehuman life which we can share right now. However, because it is the life of the Conqueror of Death it will certainly impel us beyond the grave: 'The one who eats this bread will live *forever*.'

We could take a moment to pray to more fervently realise and take advantage of the fact that, at every Mass, we can respond to the invitation to come forward to Holy Communion so as to be enwombed in the maternal Christ.

t Clare of Assisi was born in Italy in 1194 AD to a wealthy noble family. As a child she was devoted to prayer and at the age of eighteen she heard L St Francis of Assisi preach and she was inspired to follow his example, despite the protestations of her family. After living a life of strict poverty with the Benedictine nuns, she eventually lead a new order known as the "Poor Ladies of San Damiano". For a time the order was directed by St Francis himself, and Clare cared for him in his final days. In 1224 the Prussian King, Frederick II led an army to take the town of Assisi. It is believed that Clare faced the army carrying only the Blessed Sacrament, and that suddenly the army was overcome with fear and fled. Ten years after her death in 1253, her order became known as the Order of St Clare. In 1958 Pope Pius XII named Clare as the patron saint of television based on the story that when she was sick and unable to attend mass she could reportedly see and hear it on the wall of her room.
