

Newsletter information for 3rd and 4th August- Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B A Hunger Beyond Bread

The scene in today's Gospel is familiar. Jesus has just performed the miraculous feeding of the five thousand. The crowd, bellies full and spirits high, chase after him. But listen closely to their question: "What must we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus, however, sees a deeper hunger within them. A hunger not for physical sustenance, but for something that will truly satisfy. He calls them to a different kind of work – the work of believing in him, the bread of life.

This message resonates powerfully in our world today, a world grappling with a multitude of problems. Consider the vast inequalities that plague our planet. Millions go hungry each day, while others struggle with the burden of overconsumption. We grapple with climate change, a consequence of our insatiable desire for "more." Jesus reminds us that true fulfillment comes not from material possessions, but from a deeper connection to something greater than ourselves.

Jesus offers himself as the answer. He is the bread that gives life to the world and the hand of God never leaves us to hunger and thirst without justice being done.

And yet in our world we see the continued crying out of those who are displaced or without future. Think of the families struggling to put food on the table, the communities devastated by natural disasters and remember the refugees fleeing war and persecution. They are all hungry – hungry for justice, for peace, for a life of dignity. The biblical story is our inspiration to continue to stand up for all those who have lost their daily bread, to speak out where hope is lost and darkness falls. Like so many in our world, these are the people who witness to us what living day by day must mean.

This is why we feed ourselves on the body of Christ at the Eucharist. We partake of the bread of life in order that we may become what we eat: bread broken for a hungry world. When we participate in the Eucharist, we cannot remain untouched by the hunger of the world around us. When we participate in the Eucharist, we also learn that there is one beyond ourselves that feeds us and forms us.

Jesus' call to believe in him, the bread of life, isn't just about personal salvation but a call to action. Many in our world today are hungry – hungry for food, for justice, for peace, for love. Jesus calls us to be the bread of life for them. We can share our resources, advocate for the oppressed, offer kindness and compassion.

Let us not be satisfied with simply filling our own bellies. Let us be the hands that distribute the true bread of life, a bread that can nourish not just bodies, but souls. By working towards solutions to these real-life problems in our communities, we become instruments of his love, sharing the bread of life with those who hunger most.

This week, reflect on your own hunger. What truly satisfies you? What can you do to share the bread of life with those around you? In doing so, we become living testaments to the power of Jesus' message that can transform our hearts and the world itself.

The Living Word

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

4 August 2024

First Reading Ex 16:2-4, 12-15

I will rain bread from heaven upon you.

The whole community of the sons of Israel began to complain against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our hearts content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!'

Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion; I propose to test them this way to see whether they will follow my law or not.'

'I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have bread to your hearts content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God." And so it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That' said Moses to them 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.'

Responsorial Psalm

Put on the new person that has been created in God's image.

I want to urge you in the name of the Lord, not to go on living the aimless kind of life that pagans live. Now that is hardly the way you have learnt from Christ, unless you failed to hear him properly when you were taught what the truth is in Jesus. You must give up your old way of life; you must put aside your old self, which gets corrupted by following illusory desires. Your mind must be renewed by a spiritual revolution so that you can put on the new self that has been created in God's way, in the goodness and holiness of the truth.

No one lives on bread alone,

but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.

Gospel Jn 6:24-35

Whoever comes to me will never be hungry; whoever believes in me will never thirst.

When the people saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into boats and crossed to Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found him on the other side, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat.

Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life,

the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you,

for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal.'

Then they said to him, 'What must we do if we are to do the works that God wants?' Jesus gave them this answer, 'This is working for God: you must believe in the one he has sent.' So they said, 'What sign will you give to show us that we should believe in you? What work will you do? Our fathers had manna to eat in the desert; as scripture says: He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'

Jesus answered

- 'I tell you most solemnly,
- it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven,
- it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven,

the true bread:

for the bread of God

is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'

'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered:

'I am the bread of life.

He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.'



Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Some religions, and even strands of Catholicism, try to suppress appetites in order to achieve some 'out-of-thisworld' liberation. But appetites are good things, telling us what we humans need as bodily, social, spiritual beings. They provide a reality check against our tendency to think that salvation is exclusively about the soul.

Our appetites for food and drink, for affection and companionship, for the truth about the Big Picture of our life journey, need to be satisfied or we disintegrate in various ways.

Our Lord Jesus Christ proclaims in today's Gospel that He is the total satisfaction of our deepest human appetites: 'I am the Bread from Heaven which gives life to the world.'


That 'Life' is nothing less than participation in Divine Life, existing in the Big Picture in the way God intended. That is the nourishment offered not to a particular tribe or ethnic group, but to the whole of humanity, indeed to the whole of creation.

We could take a moment to pray for faith to recognise that the bread brought up at the Offertory is truly transformed: no longer short term food like manna in the desert, but 'the Bread of Life', the Real Presence of the One who nourishes our humanity, indeed who gives Life to the world.



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t Lawrence was a deacon who lived in Rome at a time when Christians were being persecuted. He was closely associated with Pope Sixtus II, who was martryed a few days before Lawrence at the hands of Emperor Valerian. Popular tradition tells of Lawrence's rather gruesome death by fire, although he was most likely executed with a sword, which was the usual method of capital punishment at the time. He became one of the early church's most popular martrys and was especially renowned for his alms giving. Together with St Stephen, Lawrence is a patron of deacons.
