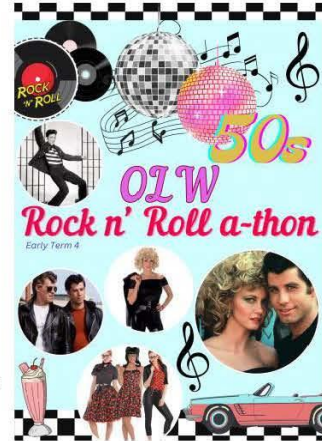

Parents are invited to join your child/ren on this special day and particularly in the Year 6 50's Grease performance/ special performers showcase!

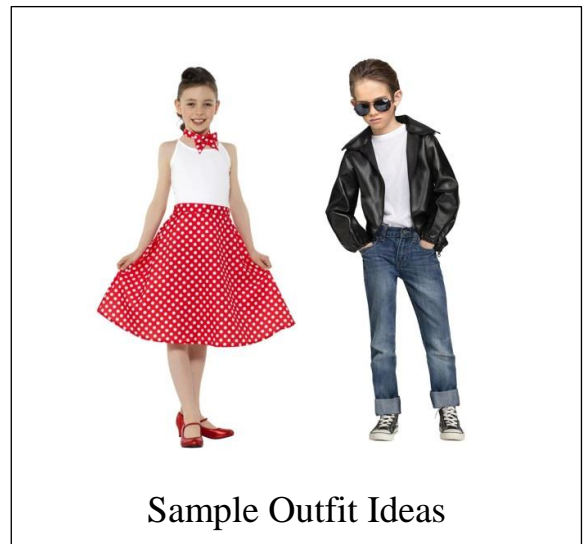

**REFLECTION: PART 7 ‘WHO DO WE THINK WE ARE?’  
We are the ‘Church’**

In common usage, the word Church has come to mean the authorities in the Church or the teaching authority of the Church, what we call the Magisterium. So, when we say or read such phrases as “The Church teaches...”, it is the official Church which is meant by the word. Even though so common, this meaning of the word is not original and is not what is meant by Church when the word comes up in the Scriptures.

The original Hebrew word which church translates is ‘qahal’. This is the word which is used in the Old Testament to designate Israel, the People of God. It means those chosen by God to belong to him in a particular way; not chosen against other peoples but ultimately for other peoples. In the Greek language of the New Testament, the word used to translate the Hebrew ‘qahal’ is ‘ekklesia’ which similarly means those called aside to particularly belong to God. The Latin for this Greek word is ‘ecclesia’ from which so many words we use are derived: ecclesial, ecclesiastical etc. It is this word which is translated by our word ‘Church’.

When we come across, the word ‘church’ or ‘churches’ in the New Testament, this is the meaning which that word has. The Church is the gathered disciples of Christ, not just those who hold positions of authority. We together are indeed the Church. The word applies to the gathered community of faith. As last week’s contribution to this series said in answer to the question, ‘Who do we think we are?’, We are a We! We are a group which Christ gathers to himself to be his in a more intense way, to be his in a way which relates to him in hearing and responding to his word and in entering into communion with him in the Eucharist. We will go on over the next few weeks to look at the images which the New Testament gives us of what the Church is, that is, of what we are. These images are rich in content and take us inside this group of human beings who belong to Christ.

## Second Reading Heb 5:1-6

*You are a priest forever in the line of Melchizedek.*

Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; and so he can sympathise with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too lives in the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by God, as Aaron was. Nor did Christ give himself the glory of becoming high priest, but he had it from the one who said to him: You are my son, today I have become your father, and in another text: You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever.

## Gospel Mk 10:46-52

*Master, grant that I may see.*

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.



## Reflection by Rev. T Nguyen

In today's gospel, it tells us that Jesus had just left the city of Jericho accompanied by his disciples. Many other people also followed him. St Mark explains what happened when Jesus met a blind man named Bartimaeus. The blind man was sitting by the side of the road, as he usually did, asking for some donations. Something made him realise that a large group of people were coming closer to him. Without thinking twice, he began to cry out desperately, "Jesus, have mercy on me."

When they heard him, many of those who were there scolded him, telling him to stop shouting. But he did not pay attention to them as he continued to cry out. Normally, Bartimaeus because he was blind, trusted in the counsel of those people who helped him. But on this occasion, he felt that he needed to get Jesus to help him and so ignoring those around him, he placed all of his hope in the one person that he thought could heal him. Jesus, upon hearing his cries said, "Bring him to me." Bartimaeus did not wait for anyone to help him. He jumped up and approached Jesus. And the Lord cured him. It was his faith that most impressed the Lord.

Bartimaeus, sitting at the side of the road hopelessly waiting to recover his sight, found the road, the way, and the truth. He found Jesus and when he felt the Lord's presence and heard the Lord speak, he raised his voice and shouted so that the Lord could hear him. He did not ask the Lord immediately to cure his blindness, he simply said, "Lord, have mercy on me." He placed all of his hope in the Master. He did not have faith because he was cured; he was cured because he had faith. And when Jesus cured Bartimaeus, he felt great peace of heart and soul and he followed Jesus.

Can we also feel that peace within our hearts? Let us follow the example of Bartimaeus. Let us go to the Lord with faith and ask him to help us, to have mercy on us, to open our eyes and our hearts so that we can see his splendour and feel his love.



**S**t Simon and St Jude were two of Jesus' twelve apostles. St Simon was known as 'the Canaanite' or 'the Zealot' by other evangelists and St Jude was a blood relative of Jesus and known as one of the 'brethren of the Lord'. Little, however, is known about either of these apostles after the events at Pentecost. Western traditions suggest that St Simon preached in Egypt before joining St Jude in Persia, where they were both martyred. In recent times, St Jude has become popular as the patron of 'hopeless causes'. This probably originates from early Christians confusing St Jude with Judas, who betrayed Jesus. As a result people never prayed for his help and so devotion to St Jude became somewhat of a lost or hopeless cause.

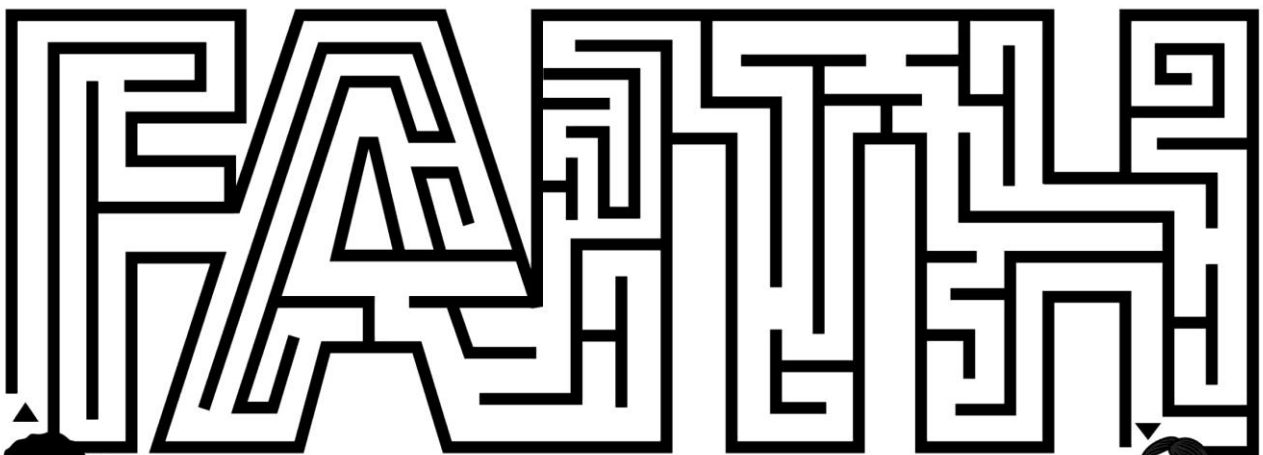

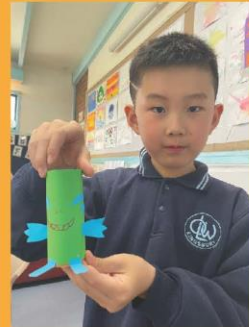
We had so many highlights, including Toilet roll Monster making, Monster Spray Art, Mask making and delicious cookies to enjoy as well!
