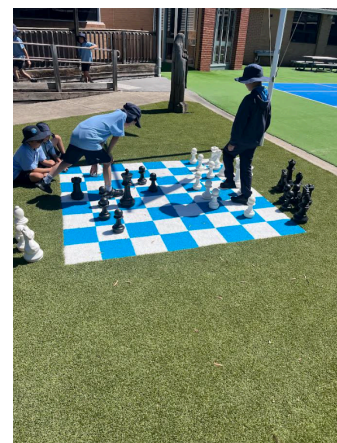

**Boys:** Blue school polo shirt, navy school shorts, navy/white socks and black shoes/runners.

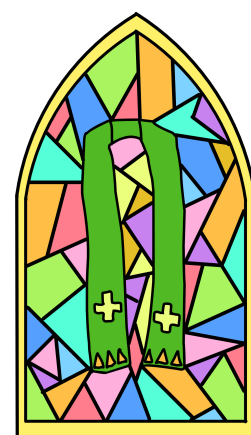

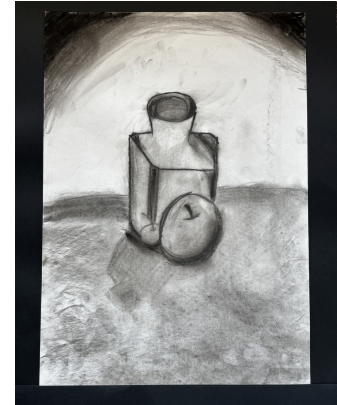

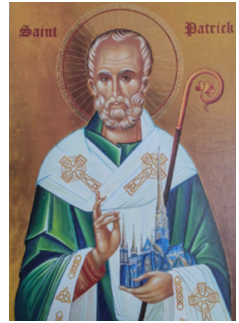

## *Catholic Education Week and St. Patrick's Day*

Next week we celebrate **Catholic Education Week**, a special time when Catholic schools across the **Archdiocese of Melbourne** celebrate their faith, their learning, and the important role Catholic education plays in our communities.

This year's theme, "**Christ Beside Me: Walking in the Footsteps of Saint Patrick,**" highlights the life and mission of **Saint Patrick**, the patron saint of our local Church in Melbourne. Saint Patrick is well known for bringing Christianity to Ireland. One of the ways he helped people understand the Christian faith was by using a shamrock to explain the **Holy Trinity**—the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit—three persons in one God, just as the shamrock has three leaves on one stem. Saint Patrick spent 40 years travelling throughout Ireland preaching about God's love and sharing the message of the Gospel.

Our mother church in Melbourne, St Patrick's Cathedral, is named in honour of Saint Patrick. Last year, during the Jubilee celebrations, a striking new icon of Saint Patrick was unveiled and blessed by Peter A Comensoli in front of thousands of students and educators.

Catholic Education Week runs from Sunday 15 March to Sunday 22 March 2026. During this time there are several special events across the Archdiocese, including the Mass of St Patrick for Schools, the Concert in the Park, the Young Speakers Colloquium, and the Creative Arts Exhibition.

To help celebrate Catholic Education Week and Saint Patrick's Day, some of our students will attend the Mass of St Patrick for Schools on Friday 20 March. Our talented Art teacher, Lisa Hrisikos, will also be leading students in a special art session.

Catholic Education Week reminds us that Christ walks beside us in our daily lives—at school, at home, and in our community—just as Saint Patrick trusted in God throughout his mission.

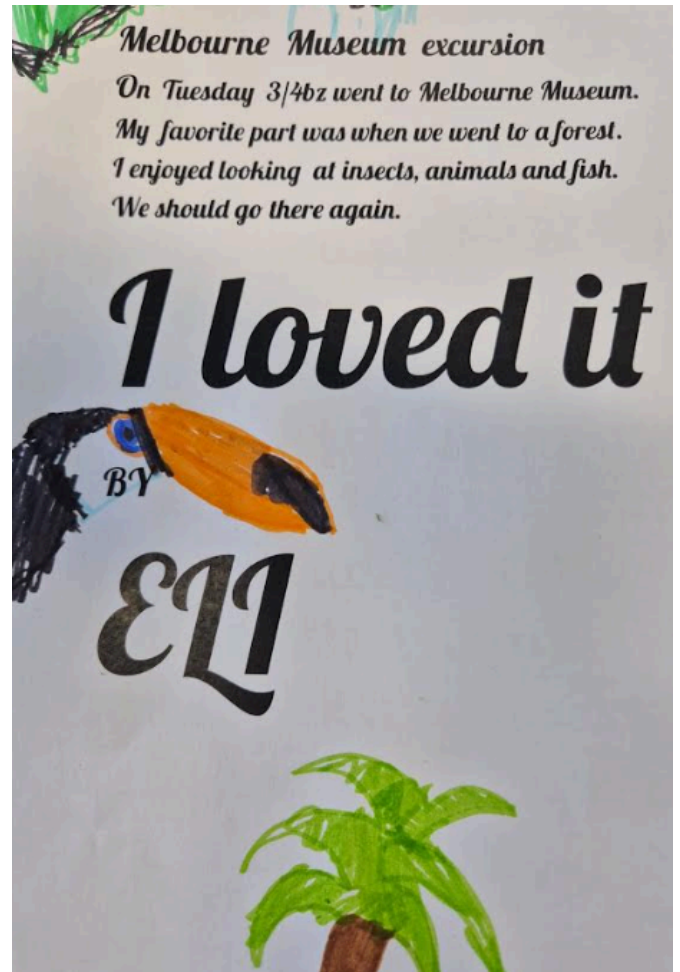
# OLW - Out and About - Year 3/4 Excursion to Melbourne Museum

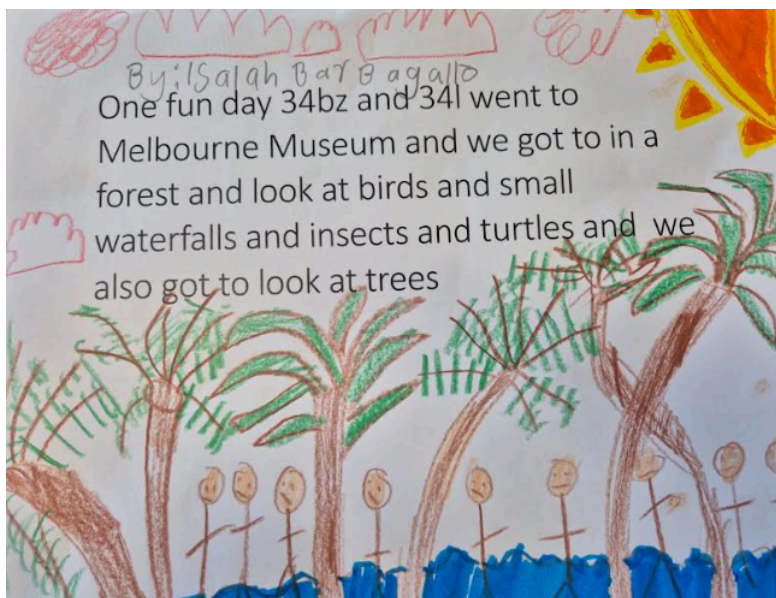

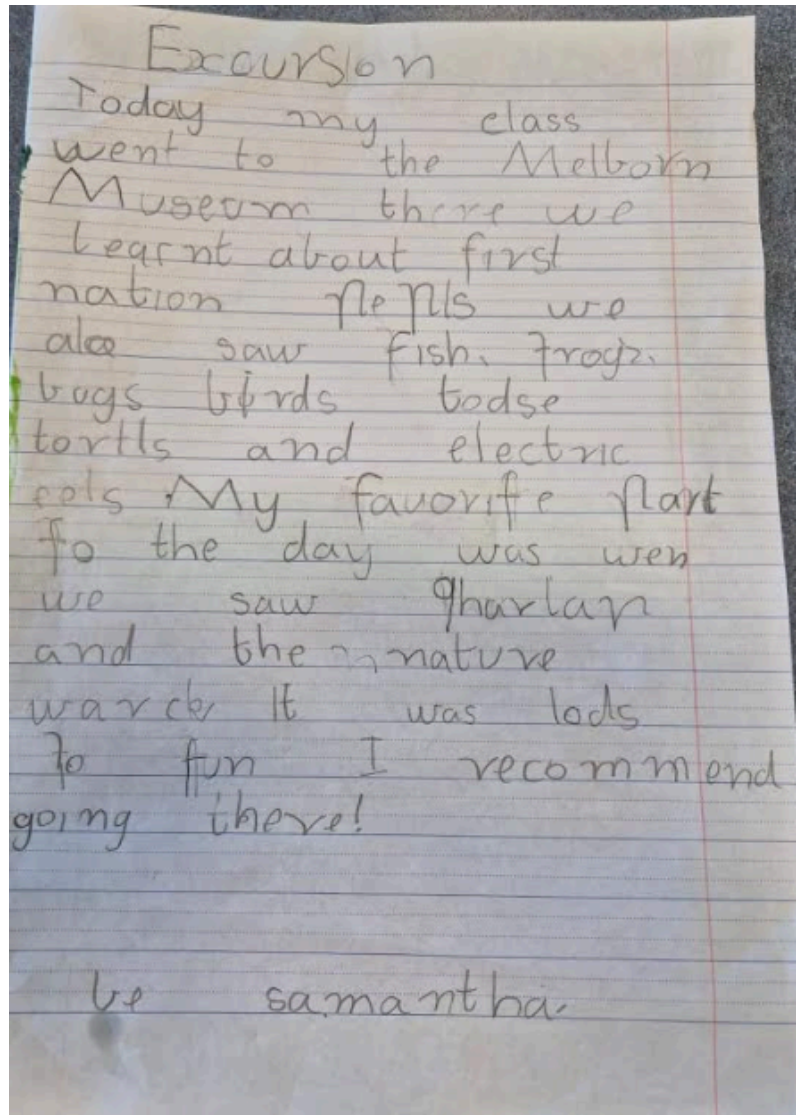
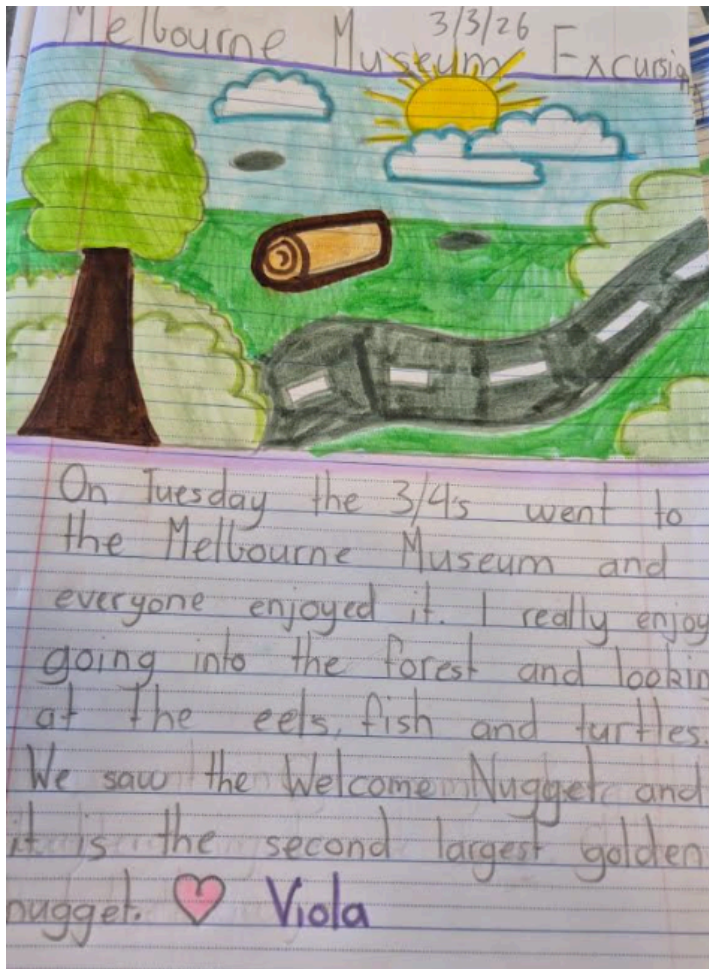
# OLW - Out and About - Year 3/4 Excursion to Melbourne Museum

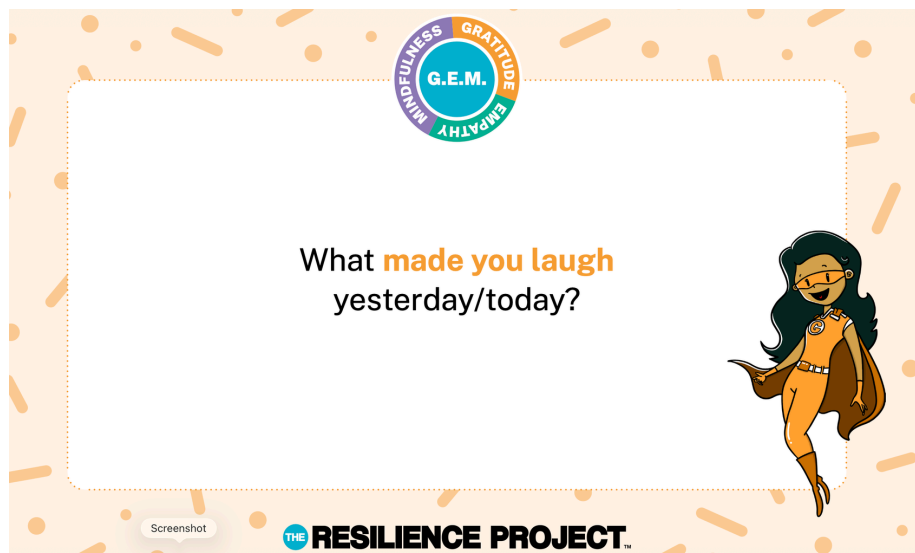

# Choosing a Gratitude Mindset

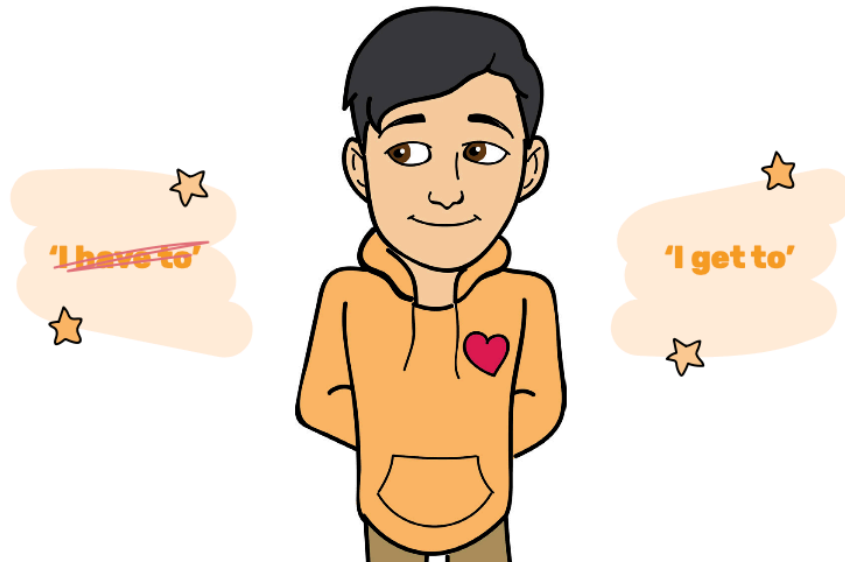
**HOW CAN YOUR FAMILY PRACTICE THIS TOGETHER?**

## Child Safe Standards - 11 Months 11 Standards

The Child Safe Standards are a set of 11 requirements that organisations must follow to create a culture and environment that is safe for children. These standards aim to prevent, respond to, and report child abuse by requiring organisations to implement policies, procedures, and practices that put children's safety and well-being first. They were developed in response to inquiries and recommendations from Royal Commissions and aim to drive cultural change within organisations that provide services or facilities for children. The staff of OLW will be revisiting the standards (one each month). We will continue to share the standards with our OLW families.



## Child Safe Standard 2

**"Child safety and wellbeing is embedded in organisational leadership, governance and culture."**

Rooted in the Gospel and the teachings of the Church, MACS Catholic schools uphold the sacred dignity of every child as created in the image and likeness of God (Genesis 1:27). This belief places Catholic educators in a privileged and profound position to protect and nurture the most vulnerable.

This newsletter series provides an overview of what the Child Safe Standards are, how they are designed to help keep children and young people safe and what school governed by Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) are doing to prioritise and achieve this.

### Overview of Child Safe Standard 2:

To be aligned, schools must support the following:

- A public commitment to child safety
- Champion a child safe culture at all levels
- Ensure governance supports child safety policies
- Develop and enforce a Code of Conduct
- Implement risk management strategies that focus on preventing, identifying and mitigating risks to children
- Ensure staff, volunteers and contractors understand their obligation and the role they play in keeping children and young people safe. This includes information sharing and record keeping.

### The Child Safe Standards

The Child Safe Standards are a set of guidelines that help organisations create safe environments for children and young people.

They make sure that children are protected from harm, listened to, and respected. These standards require organisations to have strong leadership, clear policies, and a culture that puts children first.

As a parent or carer, you can expect organisations to involve families, empower children, train staff properly, and respond to concerns quickly and respectfully.

This standard promotes a shared responsibility for safety across the entire school community and all levels of the organisation. It ensures a child safe culture is actively championed and modelled from the top down and bottom up.

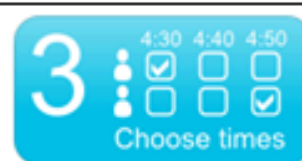
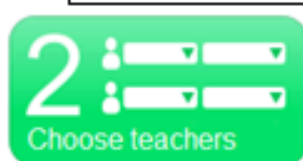
